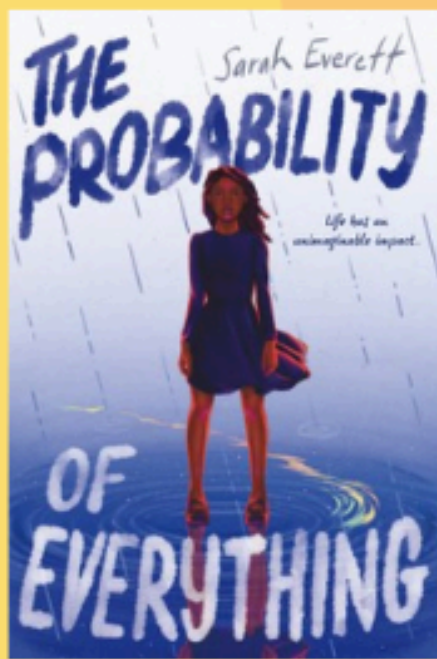
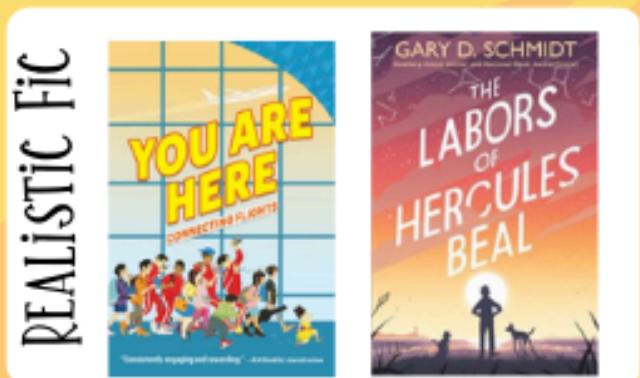
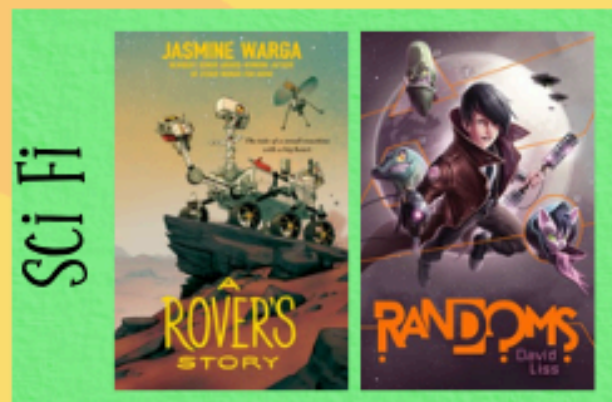

Students who read **at least five books** during the summer can maintain important literacy skills.

All types of reading count- don't scoff at their preference for audio books or graphic novels. Both trigger wonderful connections in the brain.
