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SCHOOL DISTRICT AND COMMUNITY

Elkins High School is one of 11 traditional high schools in the Fort Bend Independent School District. Elkins High School opened in the fall of 1992 as the sixth high school in Fort Bend ISD. The school was named after Lawrence E. Elkins, a former teacher, coach, administrator and superintendent in FBISD from 1949 - 1984. Elkins boasts an Engineering Academy where students are exposed to robust academy and academic coursework ensuring college readiness in the field of engineering. Other notable accomplishments at the "Castle of Champions" have included two UIL State Academic Championships, three State Baseball Championships, one State Softball Championship, one State Golf Championship and numerous district championships in academics, athletics and fine arts. Today, Elkins serves 2572 students from the Quail Valley, Lake Olympia and Riverstone Communities.

- UIL-sponsored athletic programs for young men and women are offered in football, basketball, tennis, track, soccer, golf, swimming, baseball, softball, and volleyball.
- Co-curricular programs include choir, band, drill team, student government, service and academic clubs, athletics and Academic Decathlon.
- Gifted and Talented programs are available in English, Math, Social Studies, and Science.
- Instruction is available for special needs through Special Education, English for Speakers of other Languages, and 504 services.
