Dear Ranger Family,

The student flyers advertising club meetings, concerts, travel opportunities, cap and gown information, and hygiene tips spoke to no one. Our beautiful Commons mural oversaw empty tables and a sparkling clean floor. Classrooms, gyms, and performance halls waited patiently for happy kids. I have been at school many times when it was empty (winter break especially). During those times, it always felt like the building was taking a deep breath as it rested from the never-ending pace of CHS. Not last week. Our old creaking walls actually expressed a sad loneliness to me. I am sure it was echoing my own emotions because right now I am aware of the loss and isolation that many students are feeling. I am especially worried about our seniors, the truly outstanding Class of 2020.

My daughter is a FBISD senior. I am acutely sensitive to the fact that our seniors will likely miss many, if not all, of their highly anticipated landmark activities: final academic and athletic contests, concerts, banquets, prom, and so on. The CHS and FBISD staff will do our best to salvage what we can of this semester. However, we all know that the spring of 2020 will forever have an asterisk by it. Nothing is normal right now; nothing is "fair." It is important that adults speak openly and honestly with kids about this fact. Please provide a perspective to your children that acknowledges their emotions but also reminds them that there is so much in their young lives to anticipate with excitement. Have them develop plans for tomorrow, next week, the summer, and beyond. Then help them enact those plans.

Life is not completely gloomy right now. I am inspired by Clements teachers and students who are interacting online in fun and enriching ways. Likewise, many Rangers are helping others in the community by connecting virtually with senior citizens, delivering food and care packages, cleaning neighborhood parks, and sharing educational enrichment activities. Clements High School was having a superb year in so many areas: academics, the arts, athletics, I-Lunch, Mrs. Menzie as FBISD Teacher-of-the-Year finalist, Mr. Daughters as FBISD Secondary Rookie of the Year, etc. Those accomplishments will not be forgotten and provide a strong foundation for when we return to normalcy.
