



College, Career, Military Ready | Texas Success Initiative What is a CCMR Indicator?

George Bush High school is committed to ensuring ALL students meet ONE CCMR indicator by graduation to guarantee success in their postsecondary goals.

College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR) prepares students for life after graduation. It comprises curriculum, resources, programs, and activities that will help students have the tools they need to enter college or the workforce and begin a career. Being college and career-ready can assist students with being prepared for postsecondary education or training that can result in better job opportunities.

CCMR Indicators: Meet **ONE** of the following

- SAT Score English 480+ and Math 530+
- ACT Score English 19+, Math 19+, AND 23+ composite
- TSIA Score English 945+ AND 5 on the Essay OR Math 950+OR 910-949
- Dual Credit 3 credits in English or Math or 9 hours in any subject
- AP Exam Score 3 or higher on an AP exam
- Earn Industry Certification
- Military Enlistment if the graduate enlists in the US armed forces by 12/31 immediately following HS graduation and the district uploads the completed DD FORM 4.



What does it mean to be College Ready?


A student who is "college ready" is prepared for any postsecondary goal without the need for college remediation*. The student meets the minimum Texas Success Initiative scores through the SAT, ACT, or TSIA.

What does it mean to be Career Ready?

The student has completed or is working towards an industry certificate. The student has met TSI benchmark through the SAT, ACT, or TSIA.

What does it mean to be Military Ready?

The student has successfully completed the ASVAB exam and met the required score for a specific branch of the military. The student has completed and submitted enlistment documentation to the recruiter and high school.



What is the Texas Success Initiative?

The TSI Assessment (TSIA) is part of the Texas Success Initiative program designed to help your college or university determine if you are ready for college-level course work in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics. If you are an incoming college student in Texas, you are required to take the TSI Assessment - unless you are already exempt (see above) - to determine your readiness for college-level work. Based on how you perform, you may either be enrolled in a college-level course and/or be placed in the appropriate developmental course or intervention to improve your skills and prepare you for success in college-level courses.

The TSIA is not a graduation requirement, but if you are attending a college or university in Texas you are required to take and pass the TSIA test to enroll in college level courses if you do not meet the TSIA exemption requirements (listed below). Successful completion of the TSIA will ensure success in your postsecondary educational goals and ensure that you are college, career, and military ready.

TSIA Exemptions

ACT: composite score of 23 with a 19
minimum on Mathematics and/or English
SAT: A minimum score of 530 on the

mathematics test for a TSI exemption in math

(no combined score required)

•SAT: A minimum score of 480 on the Evidenced-Based Reading & Writing (EBRW) for a TSI exemption in both reading and writing (no combined score required)

 Dual Credit Course: Grade of "C" or better in any college-level English, History, Government, or Behavioral Science course (TSI reading and writing exemption); Grade of "C" or better in any college level Math course (TSI math exemption) • Attending an out-of-state university or college



TSI Testing Information for GBHS Seniors who have not yet met a CCMR (College, Career, and Military Readiness) indicator will attend a "CCMR Not Met" assembly. The TSIA test is one of keyways students can meet a CCMR indicator at this stage.

We are pleased to offer the TSIA (Texas Success Initiative Assessment) at no cost to all seniors who need to take the test. Testing will begin in October. A sign-up link for TSI testing will be sent via a Microsoft Form by Mrs. Haynes through FBISD communication channels.

Automatic Admission in Texas



Automatic College Admission Policy

In accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC), §51.803, a student is eligible for automatic admission to a college or university as an undergraduate student if the applicant earned a grade point average in the top 10 percent of the student's high school graduating class, or the top 8 percent for admission to the University of Texas at Austin, and the applicant:

- successfully completed the requirements for the Recommended High School Program (RHSP) or the Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP)*; or
- (2) satisfied ACT's College Readiness Benchmarks on the ACT assessment or earned on the SAT assessment a score of at least 1,500 out of 2,400 or the equivalent.

In accordance with Title 19 Texas Administrative Code (TAC), §5.5(e), high school rank for students seeking automatic admission to a general academic teaching institution on the basis of class rank is determined and reported as follows:

- (1) Class rank shall be based on the end of the 11th grade, middle of the 12th grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the application deadline.
- (2) The top 10 percent of a high school class shall not contain more than 10 percent of the total class size.
- (3) The student's rank shall be reported by the applicant's high school or school district as a specific number out of a specific number total class size.
- (4) Class rank shall be determined by the school or school district from which the student graduated or is expected to graduate.

An applicant who does not satisfy the course requirements is considered to have satisfied those requirements if the student completed the portion of the RHSP or the DAP that was available to the student but was unable to complete the remainder of the coursework solely because courses were unavailable to the student at the appropriate times in the student's high school career as a result of circumstances not within the student's control.

To qualify for automatic admission an applicant must:

- (1) submit an application before the deadline established by the college or university to which the student seeks admission; and
- (2) provide a high school transcript or diploma that indicates whether the student has satisfied or is on schedule to satisfy the requirements of the RHSP or DAP* or the portion of the RHSP or DAP that was available to the student.

Colleges and universities are required to admit an applicant for admission as an undergraduate student if the applicant is the child of a public servant who was killed or sustained a fatal injury in the line of duty and meets the minimum requirements, if any, established by the governing board of the college or university for high school or prior college level grade point average and performance on standardized tests.

*Students graduating in 2018 or after must earn distinguished level of achievement to be eligible for top 10% automatic admission.

College Application Process



SAT Fee Waiver - Must have used a SAT fee waiver to take SAT exam. Electronic fee waivers loaded in the student's MySAT score page.

NACAC Fee Waiver -

There is not a limit to the number of NACAC Fee Waivers that a student is allowed to use, however, NACAC recommends that the student limit the number to four (4). The form is available online, but must be printed and signed by the student's counselor or CCRA.



ACT Fee Waiver - Must have used an ACT fee waiver to take ACT exam. Student can request fee waiver from counseling department.



Fee waivers are to be mailed to university's admissions office or can be uploaded through the "document upload system" in the students university application status account.

- 2 Safe School (schools you are auto admitted to)
- 1-2 Target School (schools you meet college "range")
- 1-2 Dream School (schools you are not within the school's "range" or the school has a less than 20% acceptance rate)

- Remember each college application site requires different essay prompts.

Are you attending a university or a community college?

Community colleges do not require ACT or SAT

➢ It is NOT too late to take the ACT or SAT Take it NOW!

Seniors should sign up for the earliest test dates possible.

Test results come back in 17-21 days

*Take both the ACT and SAT!

- Colleges do NOT prefer SAT over ACT or vice versa.
- Colleges accept ACT & SAT equally.
- Many students do better on one test over the other. If you don't take both exams, you will NOT know what your true Academic Profile is.

Do I need to take the SAT or ACT?

Some colleges are test optional. If you do not submit an SAT or ACT score, it will not negatively affect the admissions process; however, if you do submit a higher score, it will help your application. It is considered for merit-based scholarships.

Should I take the SAT or ACT?

The ACT has more questions, with less time per question. The SAT questions are fewer in number but are more challenging and require more time to answer. The best way to find out is to take both an SAT and an ACT practice test and see which one you do better in and are more comfortable with.


