

Questions and Answers

QUESTION	If a student has a class where a final is not being given (i.e. athletics), can they bring a note and leave?	
ANSWER	NO! Students must remain on campus during any assigned classes. The ONLY way a student can leave is if they are exempt (11th & 12th only) or if a parent comes into school and checks them out which will be an absence. This applies to all students.	
QUESTION	Are Homebound students eligible for exemptions?	
ANSWER	Yes, if they meet the grade requirement and the STAAR requirement, they are eligible.	
QUESTION	Can students lose exemptions if their grade changes after the forms are submitted May 25th?	
ANSWER	No, the grades should be finalized before the exemption form is submitted to the assistant principal.
