ID Badges Required for School/Bus

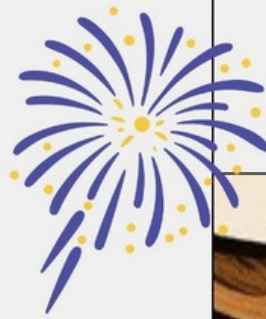
Important Reminders

Students' Cell phones/Electronic Devices

If I forget my laptop, it is my responsibility to check one out prior to 1st period & return it at the end of the day.



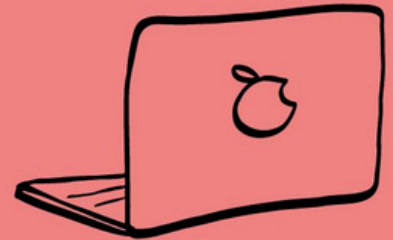
