

### **Electives**

- Number elective choices on the course selection sheet in order of preference:
   1, 2, 3, 4
- Students may not get their first choice due to availability
- In Skyward enter the first choice under "Requested" and choices 2, 3, & 4 under "Alternates"

### Band or Orchestra

- Arrangements should be made for band or orchestra instruments prior to the end of the current school year.
- Typically in May and/or June there will be an Instrument Night. More information will be coming soon.
- Failure to do so may result in band/orchestra being replaced by another elective based upon availability.

### **Academics & Electives**

 Adjustments may be made to your child's schedule if there is a need for academic support. Our Campus Assessment Coordinator (CAC) utilizes data to determine academic needs for all students.

# PreAP/GT Courses

### PreAP/GT Courses

- PreAP/GT courses are taught at a higher level of rigor than regular courses.
- Students will utilize higher order thinking skills and real world applications of skills and concepts more often than a regular grade level course.
- PreAP/GT students will have a strong command of the subject area, be organized and <u>highly motivated</u>.

### Is a Pre-AP course right for me?

### Are you up for the challenge of Pre-AP?

Pre-AP courses add depth to the already rigorous grade level curriculum. These courses will take a commitment of strong effort to see success. A student that has a low work ethic or isn't academically motivated may be more successful in a non-Pre-AP course.

### Do you have time to commit to Pre-AP academics?

Pre-AP courses are demanding of time. Reading and writing assignments, as well as projects and regular homework can be expected. If you already have commitments on your time from extracurricular activities or other outside of school responsibilities, you will need to make sure you are able to create a balance and make time for your academic work.

### At what pace do you learn new material?

The pacing of some Pre-AP courses is very fast. If you generally pick up new learning quickly, Pre-AP may be a good fit. If you generally need a few interventions before picking up new material, a non-Pre-AP course may be more appropriate for you.

### Do you intend to take AP courses/tests when available?

Pre-AP courses are designed to prepare students for the AP courses offered in FBISD. If you are committed to the study of a subject through HS up to AP level, and hope to take the associated AP test to try to earn college credit, then Pre-AP is the place for you.

### Would your current teacher recommend Pre-AP for you?

Your current teacher knows you and your learning style. You may want to have a conversation with him/her to see what his/her recommendation is for your learning path.

Your current skill set and your motivation are both important considerations!

### What are your grades like in the subjects for which you are considering Pre-AP?

If your grades in the <u>subject</u> for which you are considering Pre-AP have consistently been very good (85+) then you are thinking in the right direction. Students that have lower grade averages in a content area, may want to consider staying with the non-Pre-AP course for that content.

# What are your STAAR scores like in the subjects for which you are considering Pre-AP?

Students considering Pre-AP for ELA or SS should look at their Reading and Writing STAAR scores. Students considering Pre-AP for Math or Science should look at their Math STAAR scores. Students at or close to a Level 3 score may want to consider PreAP.

Your current ability and your motivation are both important considerations!

The State of Texas has set high standards for all students through the vertically aligned curriculum for all courses K-12. All courses follow the state curriculum, are rigorous and can be very challenging. Pre-AP courses add another level of depth to the state curriculum. Both non-Pre-AP and Pre-AP courses can lead to college level work before graduation and give students opportunities for growth and learning.

### PreAP/GT Courses

- Students who take Honors/GT classes will be expected to maintain a passing average.
- If you notice your child's grades falling –
  contact the teacher to see what can be
  done to support your child as they work
  to improve their work habits, study skills,
  and grades.

# Other Factors:

• Pre-AP/AP is not "all or nothing."
Students may enroll in as many or as few Pre-AP/AP courses as they choose. is not "all or nothing."

# Other Factors:

• It is possible to move from on-level to Pre-AP/AP sections from one year to the next. In math, it is more challenging due to the acceleration of the curriculum in 6th and 7th grades. It is possible that additional support may be needed to support the transition to Pre-AP math in middle school.

# Other Factors:

- Due to the challenging nature of Pre-AP/AP coursework, students may initially experience a drop in grades. Successful completion of coursework is generally defined as earning a 75 or higher as a semester average.
- Additional support and encouragement is important to help sustain student participation in rigorous classes.

# Guidelines for Exiting a Pre-AP Course

 Students are expected to seek support when needed to be successful in a Pre-AP course. Actions taken should include tutorials and conferencing with the teacher.

# Guidelines for Exiting a Pre-AP Course

 Requests to level down will be considered after the first three (3) weeks of school and only if space is available in the new class. Prior to requesting a change in level, the student and parent must have met with the teacher and put in place a plan for success. If the teacher and student feel the plan has been followed, and the student has completed all assignments, a request for a conference to discuss removal may be made.

## Guidelines for Exiting a Pre-AP Course


- Success in a Pre-AP course is defined as having a grade of 75 or above.
- Students who earn an F in a Pre-AP course at the end of a grading period may be removed from the class unless otherwise recommended by the teacher and administrator. Students assigned to DAEP may lose their Pre-AP class.

### Gifted & Talented Students

- Students who are Gifted & Talented (GT)
  identified will automatically be placed in their GT
  identified subject area classes.
- Cluster grouping places a select number of GT students together for instruction. Grouping gifted students together provides opportunities for them to work with cognitive peers.


