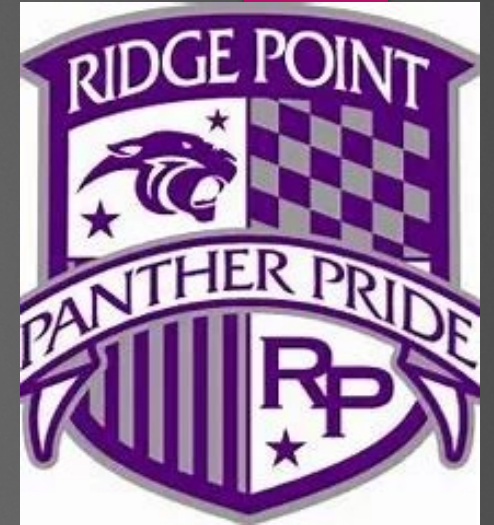

# High School Grading & GPA

- **FBISD uses a 100 point GPA Scale**
- **AP, Beyond AP Courses, Dual Credit & OnRamps Courses: 10 point weight**
- **AAC, Honors Courses: 5 point weight**
- **On Level Courses: Unweighted**

Advanced Placement (AP)/ Beyond AP Courses, Dual Credit Courses, OnRamps Courses	AAC, Honors Courses	On Level Courses
Receives 10 point weight	Receive 5 point weight	Non-weighted

# High School Grading & GPA

## Example of a high school student's grades:

- Physics (**on level**) 86 = 86 points
- **AP** English III 94 = 104 points
- US History **Dual Credit** 84 = 94 points
- Athletics 100 = 100 points
- Choir 100 = 100 points
- **AAC** Pre-Calculus 86 = 91 points
- Journalism 94 = 94 points
  
- Total points = 669 points,  
divided by 7 = 95.5714286

## Selecting Course Level & Level Changes

- ▶ Consider your teachers' recommendations regarding course level
- ▶ Level changes do not begin until week 4 of the new school year.
- ▶ Students are expected to seek support from their teachers prior to a level change.
- ▶ Students experiencing success (maintaining a C or better) should remain in the class for the semester.

# Endorsements & Pathways

## Endorsement

A specified area of interest, similar to a college major, that is required for graduation.

- ▶ Multidisciplinary Studies
- ▶ STEM
- ▶ Business & Industry
- ▶ Public Service
- ▶ Arts & Humanities

## Pathway

A particular sequence of courses and credits that lead to an endorsement.

- Consider taking a Credit by Exam (CBE) the summer before 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

Are you interested in earning an endorsement through a CTE pathway?

- Know the course sequence for your desired pathway.
- Take the first course in the pathway sequence during 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

Want to participate in a certification program at Reese?

- Complete PE, Fine Art, Foreign Language, Health & Professional Communication requirements ASAP.

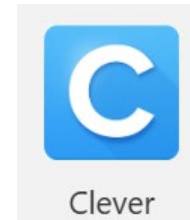
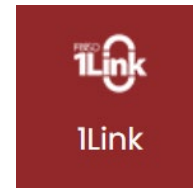

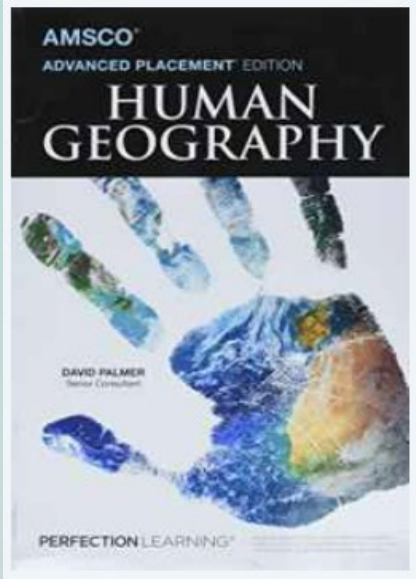

- ❖ Topics on today's world issues (migration, urbanization, cultures, economies, politics)

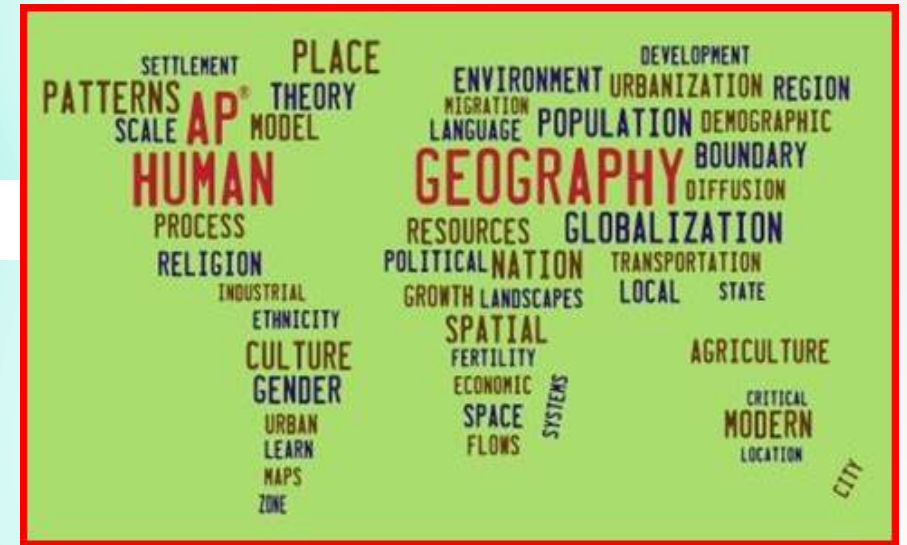
