Education and Training,

In Human Growth and Development, students examine human development across the lifespan with emphasis on research, theoretical perspectives, and common physical, cognitive, emotional, and social developmental milestones.

In Instructional Practices, students learn principles of effective teaching and training practices. Students use this knowledge to plan and direct individualized instruction and group activities, prepare instructional materials, and complete other duties of educational personnel.

In Practicum in Education and Training, students participate in a field-based internship under the joint direction and supervision of both a teacher with knowledge of early and middle childhood and adolescence education and exemplary educators in direct instructional roles with elementary, middle, and high school aged students.
