In **Disaster Response**, students will receive basic training in disaster survival and rescue skills that would improve the ability of citizens to survive until responders could arrive. Students will learn how to make communities stronger and better prepared to respond to the threats of terrorism, crime, public health issues, and disasters of all kinds.



In Emergency Medical

Technician - Basic, students will meet and exceed standard knowledge needed to be a valid Emergency Medical Technician. Students will learn skills necessary to provide entry-level emergency medical care, life support, and ambulance service.



In Firefighter I, studies include familiarization with the Texas Commission on Fire Protection Rules and Regulations, fire fighter safety, the science of fire propagation and extinguishment and protective equipment. Students will demonstrate ability to use equipment and participate in simulated activities.
