Grade 6 "Core Plus" Electives

Falcon Discovery

An orientation course designed to help 6th grade students develop skills needed for greater success in middle school.

Math Counts

A class designed to prepare students to participate in math contests such as MathCounts, UIL Number Sense, and Texas Mathematics League.

Literacy

A course designed to strengthen reading skills and develops vocabulary, comprehension, and reading fluency.

Reading STAAR performance in 5th grade is considered for enrollment.

Math Lab

A course designed to strengthen knowledge and skills in Math objectives. Math STAAR performance in 5th grade is considered for enrollment.

Pre-Advanced Placement



- Do they ENJOY a particular subject and are motivated to learn more about it?
- Are they willing to do extra reading or homework in this subject?
- Do they need a challenge in this subject because the content is easily understood?
- Do they understand the purpose of Pre-AP coursework versus regular level?

Is a Pre-AP Class Right for My Child?

- Pre-AP courses add depth and breadth to the already rigorous grade level curriculum.
- Pre-AP courses are demanding of time. Reading and writing assignments, as well as projects and regular homework can be expected. They will need to make sure they are able to balance academic work and extracurricular activities.
- The pacing of some Pre-AP courses is very fast particularly in Math. If your child generally picks up new concepts quickly, Pre-AP may be a good fit. If your child generally needs more time in order to learn new material, a non-Pre-AP course may be more appropriate for them.

Guidelines for Exiting Pre-AP Classes

Exit processes are necessary to assist students in making sound course selection decisions. Students and parents must be aware that, depending on the timeline, grades earned in Pre AP courses follow the student to the corresponding on-level course. These grades will be included in calculating the on-level course grade and may impact UIL eligibility.

- 1. Students are expected to seek support when needed to be successful in a Pre AP course. Actions taken should include tutorials and conferencing with the teacher.
- 2. Students must submit a formal request to be exited from a Pre AP course. This request will be reviewed by the teacher and campus designee(s) to consider student performance, availability of space in other courses, grading timelines, and other factors that may be at issue. Students experiencing success (maintaining a C or better for the semester) should remain in the class for the semester.
- 3. Students who earn an F in a Pre AP course at the end of the grading period may be removed from the class unless otherwise recommended by the teacher and administrator.

NOTE: If a student is successful in 6th Grade Pre-AP they will move on to 7th Grade Pre-AP.

If a student completes 7th Grade Pre-AP Math with a grade of 75% or greater they will move on to Algebra I Pre-AP.

No Screener will be given in these two cases.

**New as of 2 years ago - In order to move from 6th Grade Pre-AP to Algebra 1 Pre-AP, students will need to make an 80% or higher on both the 7th Grade CBE and the 8th Grade CBE

- *In order to move from 6th Grade to 7th Grade Pre-AP, students will need to meet the identified standard for mastery of curricular content on the District Acceleration Assessment Grade 7.
- ** In order to move from 7th Grade to Algebra 1 Pre-AP, students will need to meet the identified standard for mastery of curricular content on the District Acceleration Assessment Grade 8 or make an 80% or higher on the 8th Grade CBE.

Note: The District Acceleration Assessment is usually given sometime in May. Students who select Pre-AP Math but are currently in an on-level class will be notified of the date in time of the DAA.


