### Grade 6 "Core Plus" Electives

Falcon Discovery	An orientation course designed to help 6 <sup>th</sup> grade students develop skills needed for greater success in middle school. Such as study skills, organization, time management, goal setting, character development, effective habits and academic & social communication.
Math Counts	A class designed to prepare students to participate in math contests such as MathCounts, UIL Number Sense, and Texas Mathematics League.
Literacy	A course designed to strengthen reading skills and develops vocabulary, comprehension, and reading fluency. Reading STAAR performance in 5 <sup>th</sup> grade is considered for enrollment.
Math Lab	A course designed to strengthen knowledge and skills in Math objectives. Math STAAR performance in 5 <sup>th</sup> grade is considered for enrollment.

### Advisory

Our Advisory class is called *Falcon Time*!

This class meets 2 times a week.

Student activities during Advisory may include but is not limited to:

- Social Emotional Learning lessons
- Character Education lessons,
- Multicultural activities
- Tutorials

### Advanced Academic Courses

#### Advanced Academic Courses...

- Formerly labeled 'Pre-AP'
- add depth and breadth to the already rigorous grade level curriculum
- are demanding of time -- reading and writing assignments, as well as projects and regular homework, should be expected
- students must be able to balance academic work and extracurricular activities, considering that excessive stress can be incurred if the student takes on more than they can handle
- the pacing can be very fast particularly in math. If your child generally needs more time in order to learn new material, an on-level course may be more appropriate for them.

### **Guidelines for Exiting Pre-AP Classes**

Exit processes are necessary to assist students in making sound course selection decisions. Students and parents must be aware that, depending on the timeline, grades earned in Pre AP courses follow the student to the corresponding on-level course. These grades will be included in calculating the on-level course grade and may impact UIL eligibility.

- 1. Students are expected to seek support when needed to be successful in a Pre AP course. Actions taken should include tutorials and conferencing with the teacher.
- 2. Students must submit a formal request to be exited from a Pre AP course. This request will be reviewed by the teacher and campus designee(s) to consider student performance, availability of space in other courses, grading timelines, and other factors that may be at issue. Students experiencing success (maintaining a C or better for the semester) should remain in the class for the semester.
- 3. Students who earn an F in a Pre AP course at the end of the grading period may be removed from the class unless otherwise recommended by the teacher and administrator.

NOTE: If a student is successful in 6<sup>th</sup> Grade AAC they will move on to 7<sup>th</sup> Grade AAC. If a student completes 7<sup>th</sup> Grade AAC Math with a grade of 75% or greater they will move on to Algebra I AAC No criteria will be used in these two cases.

In order to move from 6th Grade AAC to Algebra I AAC, students will need to make an 80% or higher on both the 7th Grade CBE and the 8th Grade CBE
