AVID

An orientation course designed to help 6th grade students develop skills needed for greater success in middle school. Such as study skills, organization, time management, goal setting, character development, effective habits and academic & social communication.

Math Counts

A class designed to prepare students to participate in math contests such as MathCounts, UIL Number Sense, and Texas Mathematics League.

Literacy

A course designed to strengthen reading skills and develops vocabulary, comprehension, and reading fluency.

Reading STAAR performance in 5th grade is considered for enrollment.

Math Lab

A course designed to strengthen knowledge and skills in Math objectives. Math STAAR performance in 5th grade is considered for enrollment.

Advisory

Our Advisory class is called *Falcon Time*! (2X a week)

Advanced Academic Courses (AAC)

- Formerly labeled 'Pre-AP'
- HIGHER LEVEL THINKING
- MORE TIME REQUIRED (reading and writing assignments, as well as projects and regular homework, should be expected
- Students will need to BALANCE their work with extracurricular pursuits to avoid stress
- FAST PACING particularly in math. If your child generally needs more time in order to learn new material, an on-level course may be more appropriate for them.

Guidelines for Exiting AAC Classes

Exit processes are necessary to assist students in making sound course selection decisions. Students and parents must be aware that, depending on the timeline, grades earned in AAC courses follow the student to the corresponding on-level course. These grades will be included in calculating the on-level course grade and may impact UIL eligibility.


- 1. Students are expected to attend tutorials and communicate with teachers.
- 2. Students must submit a formal request to be exited from an AAC course. This request will be reviewed by the teacher and campus designee(s) to consider student performance, availability of space in other courses, grading timelines, and other factors that may be at issue. Students experiencing success (maintaining a C or better for the semester) should remain in the class for the semester.
- 3. Students who earn an F in a AAC course at the end of the grading period may be removed from the class unless otherwise recommended by the teacher and administrator.

Should Your Child Enroll in Advanced Academic Courses?



- Do they ENJOY a particular subject and are they motivated to learn more about it?
- Are they willing to do extra reading or homework in this subject?
- Do they need a challenge in this subject because the content is easily understood?
- Do they understand the purpose of AAC coursework versus regular level?
- Please note Gifted and Talented Students are expected to enroll in AAC courses for the subjects they are identified as GT. Students may be furloughed or exited if they are not enrolled in AAC courses.



SCHEDULE CORRECTIONS

Schedule changes will be made for the following reasons by using the Schedule Change Request Form.

- A student has already taken a class in which they are currently scheduled.
- A male has been scheduled into a female PE/Athletics, or vice versa.
- A student is in a class for which they do not have the appropriate prerequisite (i.e., enrolled in Spanish II and has not taken Spanish I).

In general, elective change requests will not be honored. However, if a student is trying to move from a regular elective into an extracurricular program (i.e., band, choir, and athletics) the request for the change will be considered but must be initiated by the coach/program director.

Course Selection Process for Rising 6th Grade

<u>Current FBISD students</u> will input courses in Skyward Family Access during the online window. Please follow the instructions from your elementary school. Middle Schools will have access to their course requests for scheduling.

Registrar will contact parent/guardian regarding registration and will request required documents.

At the end of the school year, parent provides final report card from current school. Course selection sheet and final enrollment paperwork will be provided at that time.
