


AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination)



What is PALS?

PALS APPLICATIONS (for current 7th graders only)

I'm so glad you are thinking about being a PAL and submitting an application! Here's the information about what you need to do. READ THROUGH ALL OF THE INFORMATION SO YOU DO NOT MISS A DEADLINE:

1. Join the Schoology Course (If you're here, you've done this!)
2. Be sure you've chosen PALS as one of your top 2 Elective choices in your Course Selection. Once the applications are reviewed and scored, all students will be notified if they made it into PALS or not. If you are accepted, PALS will be added to your schedule.
3. Fill out the Application in Forms: **PALS APPLICATION** (due February 19)
4. Send out 3 Teacher Recommendation forms to teachers that you have this school year. Teacher recommendations forms must be emailed to your 3 teachers by February 12th. The way to do this is to copy the link below for the form and send it to your teacher in an email. Then copy the same link and send it to your second and third teachers. Once the teachers complete the form it goes directly to me-you will not get a copy of it. Copy this link to send: [Teacher Recommendation Form](#)
5. Submit an Interview Video (See instructions in this Schoology Course for interviews and uploading). Interviews are due February 19th.
6. Wait for an email (in March) to find out if you are accepted or not. We only have a limited number of spots, so everyone will not be able to be in the class unfortunately.

The Application Window is open NOW and applications and interviews are due by February 19th. All videos and applications must be submitted on time to be considered.

How Are the Applications Scored?

Scoring Breakdown:

Short Answer (20%) + Teacher Recommendations (50%) + Interview (30%) = Final Score

1. There are five short answer response questions in the Application. Each question will be graded (by teachers on the committee) on a scale of 1-4 (1 being the lowest and 4 being the highest with a maximum score of 20).
2. Teacher recommendations [three] are averaged together
 - 1. Score of 34-36 = 10 points
 - 2. Score of 30-33 = 8 points
 - 3. Score of 25-29 = 6 points

Office Work

- Specialized elective
- Must have good behavior and grades
- Some down time, used for schoolwork/reading/studying
- Front office, counseling office, library, clinic, and others



World Languages - Grade 8

Part of high school graduation requirements is 2 years of the same language.

Students can start at FSMS with Spanish, or they can wait until high school for different options.

- **Spanish I** (1 High School Credit) – full year
- **Spanish for Spanish Speakers** (2 High School Credits in 1 year)
- **Credit By Exam (CBE)** – for fluent speakers of a language

Spanish I

- Beginning Spanish
- One full year and counts as high school credit
- Competence in authentic real-world situations
- Develop novice mid-high proficiency in speaking, listening, reading, and writing.
- Conducted in the target language as much as possible.
- Students should plan to take Spanish II in high school.



Spanish for Spanish Speakers

- Spanish I and II done in one year
- Completes the high school graduation requirement
- For students who can fluently read, write, speak, listen in Spanish.



Credit by Exam (CBE) for World Languages

- Progressive scoring
- Can reach up to Level 4
- Done in one testing session
- Registration is at the same time as CBE for other courses






