Attendance

Character education and social emotional learning lessons are delivered through advisory.

Weekly announcements are viewed during this time.

Advisory teachers complete individual student achievement checks.

Some advisories are specialized for certain programs.

HB4545

This was established by the Texas legislature in July of 2021 and is an academic support system for students who struggle on the STAAR test.

Last year we offered support three ways:

- 1. Intervention advisories
- 2. STAAR lab classes for Reading and Math
- 3. Saturday School

Academic Levels

WE OFFER TWO LEVELS OF INSTRUCTION IN ALL CORE CLASSES.

 On-level is the grade-level course. AAC stands for advanced academic curriculum and is more rigorous and moves faster than the online course.

 Some AAC level courses are still labeled GT or honors.

Level change requests

STUDENTS MAY REQUEST A LEVEL CHANGE.

Forms are available on each counselors' Schoology page and hard copy available in the counselors' office beginning August 22nd.

- Moving from AAC to an on-level course is available all year.
- Moving from On-Level to AAC may be accomplished at anytime with teacher, parent, administration and counselor approval.
- This change <u>must</u> occur within the first three weeks of school.

- Moving from AAC to On-Level will be strongly recommended if grade falls below 75
- Algebra moving to Math 8 moves should occur before the end of the first semester.
- Moves must occur before the STAAR
 Math 8 or Algebra EOC (end of
 course) exams are given May 2nd 5th.

Elective change requests

STUDENTS MAY REQUEST AN ELECTIVE CHANGE.

- Elective change request forms are available in each counselors' Schoology page and in hard copy in the counselors' office beginning August 22nd.
- Elective change requests are not guaranteed. The requested elective <u>must</u> have room in it <u>and</u> fit into the student's schedule.

PE / Kickstart / Dance/Health / Athletics

ALL STUDENTS WILL HAVE SOME FORM OF A PE CLASS EACH YEAR.

- PE Is Regular Physical Education
- Kickstart Is A Martial Arts Class (Program started by Chuck Norris) Which Counts For PE.
- Dance Explores The Different Genres of Movements- Ballet, Folk, Jazz, Tap, Hip Hop, Lyrical, Etc.
- Athletics is <u>only</u> for 8th graders and is determined by the Coaches. This counts as PE. Students who are not in athletics may still try out for and be chosen for a team.
 - Practices Are Held Before And After School Girls-Before School; Boys After School
- Only 7th And 8th graders may try out for teams (As Goverened By UIL)
- All 7th graders will have one semester OF PE OR Kickstart and one semester of Health.
