Real-world learning applications in CTE increase student engagement and motivation in school.

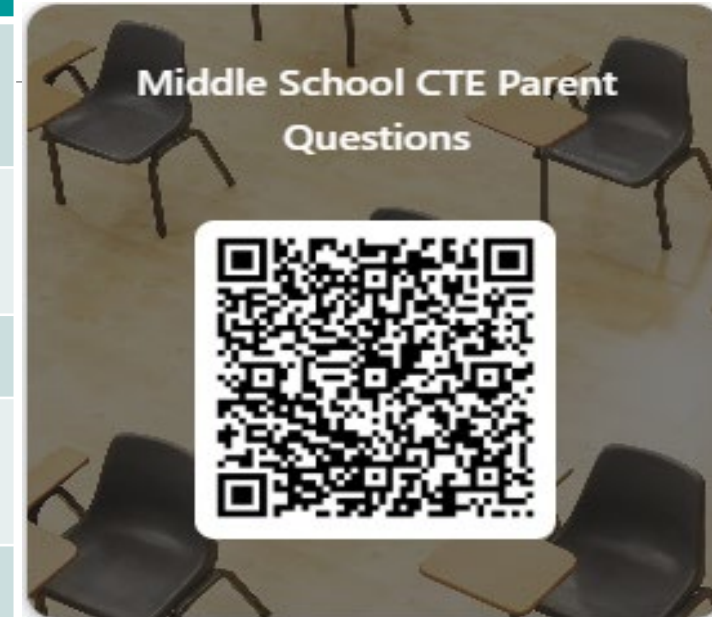

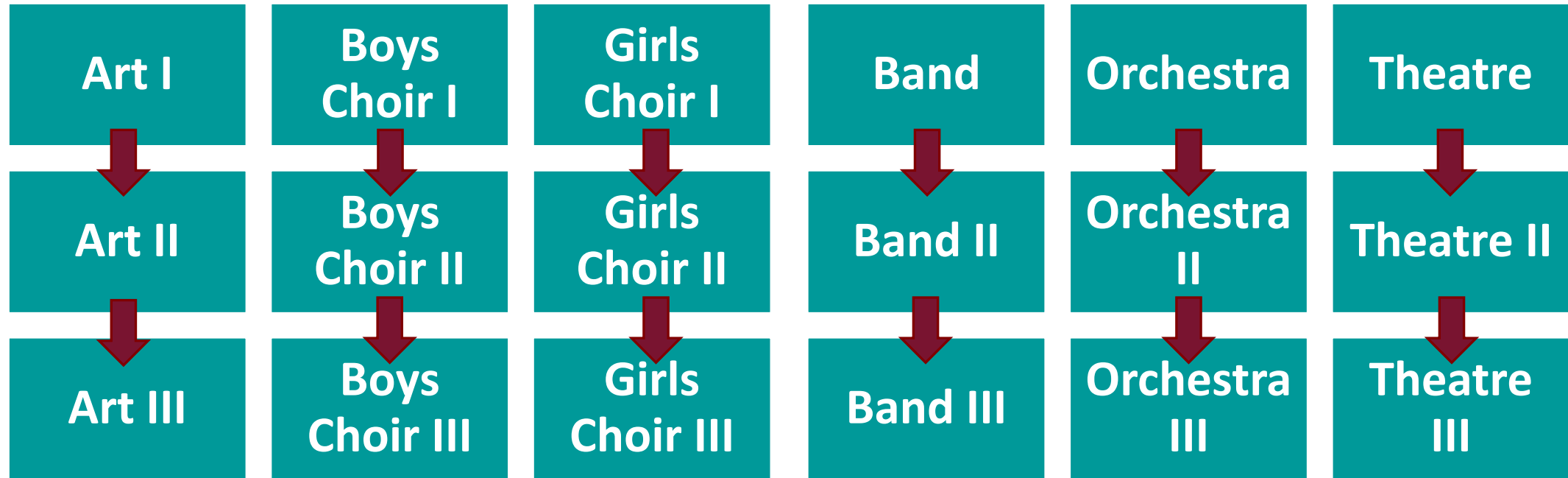

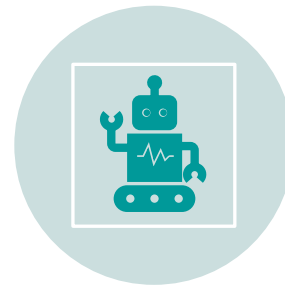

Technovation II

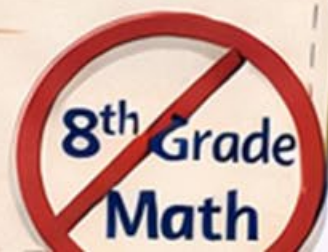
On-Level Algebra I

Going from On –Level to AAC Math

Rising 7th Graders-

- If you are currently in 6th grade on level math and want to take 7th grade AAC
 - You will need to complete a course in Edgenuity (an online platform), so you will not be lost or behind when school starts.
 - If you do not complete the course, you will be dropped from the AAC course.

Rising 8th Graders-

- If you are currently in 7th grade on level math and want to take Algebra or Algebra AAC
- You will need to speak to your counselor to sign up for the Credit By Exam (CBE) for 8th Grade Math.
 - You must make an 80 or higher on the test to receive credit and move on to Algebra or Algebra AAC for 8th grade.

*Please speak to your current Math teacher to see if AAC would be right for you

- Remember AAC courses move at a faster pace and more information is covered.

- Students will remain in any AAC course for the first 3 weeks of school before a level down change is considered. A grade of 75 is considered passing and a level-down will not be granted.
