SEMESTER CREDIT

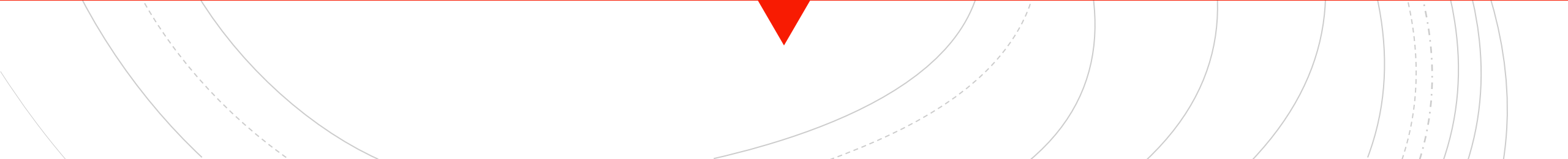
- END OF S1 = 3.5 CREDITS, EOY = 7 CREDITS
- 0.5 (half credit) for one semester course
 - ✓ earn a 70 or higher in each of your 7 classes
 - ✓ semester averaging (S1-60 + S2-80 : yearly average = 70)
- 1.0 credit for a whole year course
 - ✓ pass all 7 classes for the year
 - ✓ Summer school/credit recovery

9th Grade (Freshmen)	Less than 6 credits
10th Grade (Sophomores)	Minimum of 6 credits
11th Grade (Juniors)	Minimum of 12 credits
12th Grade (Seniors)	Minimum of 18 credits

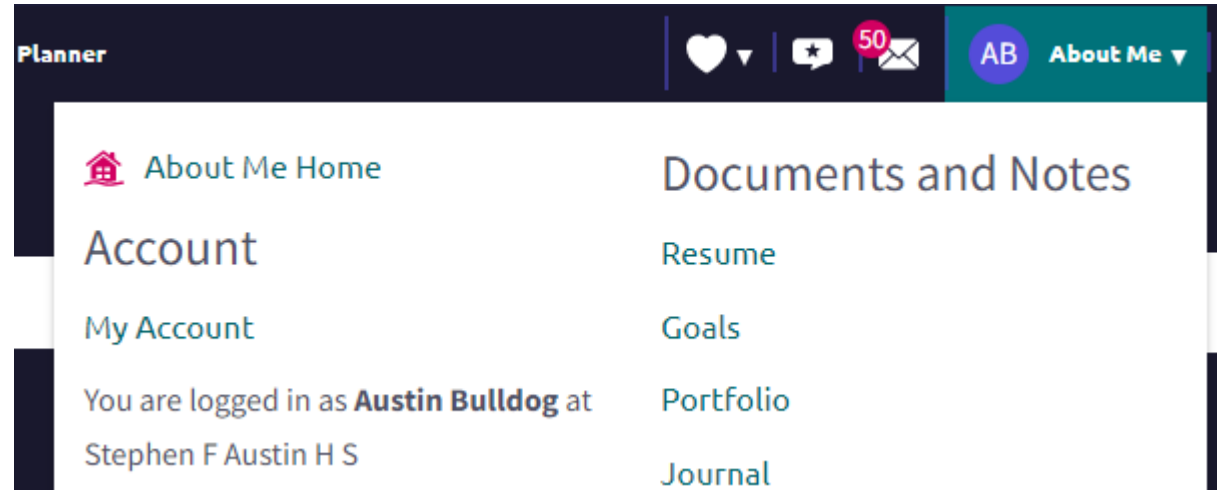

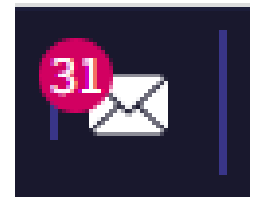

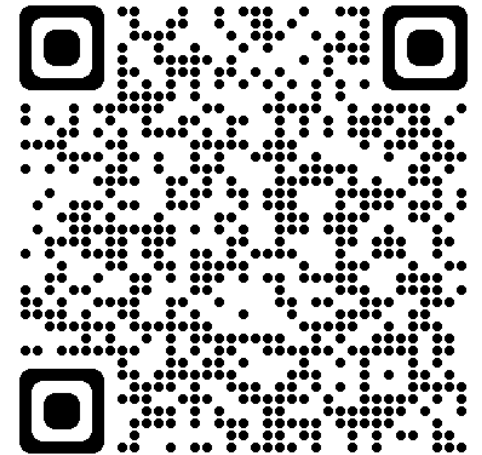
