

# Financial Aid Basics



## Types of Financial Aid

- \* "Gift" Aid
  - \* Generally does not have to be paid back
  - \* Grants: Pell, SEOG, TPEG, TEOG
  - \* Scholarships: External, Institutional, Athletic, & Departmental.
- \* "Self-Help" Aid
  - \* Loans: Subsidized, Unsubsidized, Parent PLUS
  - \* Work-Study Employment Opportunities
- \* Veteran Education Benefits
- \* State Exemptions and Waivers





## Requirements for Eligibility

https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa

- \* Be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen
- \* Have a high school diploma, GED, or completed homeschool
- \* Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)
- \* Submit all required forms and documents to the college's Financial Aid Office
- \* Enroll in an eligible program of study and maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)



## The Application (FAFSA)

(<u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>) www.studentaid.gov

- \* 2025-2026 FAFSA Fall 2025, Spring and Summer 2026
- \* 2026-2027 FAFSA- Available October 1, 2025
- \* Requires prior, prior year income (2526 2023 income, 2627 -2024 income)
- \* Used to determine eligibility for state and federal aid and some scholarships
- \* Pay attention to submission **PRIORITY DATES**, which differ by college. (WCJC: June 1st)

## Factors in Determining Aid Eligibility

- \*Parent and student income
- \*Family size
- \*Age of older parent
- \*Parent and student assets



## Completing the Process

- \* School contacts student regarding missing/needed information (tax return, asset information). When does this happen?
- \* School reviews student's file to determine eligibility (based on federal guidelines)
- \* School notifies student of eligibility/offer



## Common FAFSA Pitfalls

- \*Omitting parent information but not meeting guidelines for being an independent student
- \* Reporting non-legal guardians as parents
- \* Misreporting parents' marital status
- \* Including adult dependents who cannot be claimed on taxes



## Federal Student Loans

- \* Subsidized vs. Unsubsidized
- \* Loan limits
- \* Current interest rate: 7.94% for undergraduate borrowers
- \* Must complete Entrance Loan Counseling, a Master Promissory Note, and Exit Counseling
- \* Loan repayment begins 6 months after a student drops below half-time enrollment

## Complete Your Student Loan Entrance Counseling Requirement

Entrance counseling ensures you understand the terms and conditions of your loan and your rights and responsibilities. You'll learn what a loan is, how interest works, your options for repayment, and how to avoid delinquency and default.

When you're finished, a record of your completion will be sent to the schools you selected, and you can then receive your loan money. Keep in mind that you cannot save and leave an incomplete session; you must complete entrance counseling in one sitting.



## Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Policy is posted online and in the college catalog. **EVERY** school has a SAP Policy.

- \* Successfully complete 67% of attempted coursework.
- \* Maintain term and overall grade point average (GPA) of at least 2.0
- \* Not have attempted more than 90 credit hours (150% of program length; differs at 4-year college)
- \* College may have an appeal process if SAP is not achieved

- \* Check deadlines: Admissions,
   Financial Aid, Scholarships
- Complete the FAFSA® as soon as possible
- \* Submit all documents requested by the school as soon as possible





## Potential Changes 2026/2027

- \* Maximum Pell Grant award for 2025/2026 is \$7,395. 2026/2027 award may be reduced.
- \* Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) and College Work Study may no longer be available.
- \* Loan limits may be reduced. \$5,500 current maximum eligibility for first year borrow. \$6,500 for second year borrower.
- \* We are waiting to learn more from ED.


## State of Texas Financial Aid Graduation Requirement


In accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC), §28.0256 students enrolled in 12th grade must do one of the following in order to graduate:

- Complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA);
- Complete and submit a Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA); or
- Submit a signed opt-out form.

### **Texas Financial Aid Graduation Requirement**


- Students must provide evidence of completion to satisfy this requirement.
  - Three ways to upload completion of FAFSA, TASFA, or Opt-Out Form in Schoolinks
    - 1. Updating FAFSA status from Schoolinks To-Do List
    - 2. Updating FAFSA status from the College Financing FAFSA Card
    - 3. Updating FAFSA status in the College Application Manager

## Scholarships Can Help Pay for College

Scholarships are one of the easiest ways to earn money to help with college expenses. Looking for and submitting scholarship applications can be like having a part-time job. But, if students are willing to put in the work, they can supplement what they received through FAFSA or TASFA and help defray out of pocket expenses.

Scholarships can be submitted throughout 12<sup>th</sup> grade and every year while a student is enrolled in College.
