TEA 2019 Accountability Ratings

TEA assigns an overall letter grade to the District based on the performance of each campus. Under the state's new accountability system, which assigns a letter grade to all public school campuses in each of the state's domains, 74 of FBISD's 77 rated campuses received an A, B, or C. Only three of our District campuses received a D, and there were no F ratings. FBISD students and campuses achieved significant growth.

The new accountability system also assigns an overall letter grade to the District based on the performance of each campus. Fort Bend ISD was given a B rating because the district grade is capped at a B if any school receives an overall grade of D or F, even if the overall district score is an A. For this reason, although FBISD achieved an overall score of 90, the reported score is capped at 89.
