Academic Goals

Grade	Goal
1-2	By Spring Break 2020, [Student Name] will improve research and reading skills by researching at least 10 animals to write and illustrate a book on animals.
3-5	[Student Name] will be able to do multiplication and division facts up to 12 times 12. I will know I have reached my goal when I can do multiplication and division table quickly by May 2020.
6-8	By Spring Break, [Student Name] will improve my understanding of context clues by reading 1 book a week and track my progress by creating a context clues blog to be.
9-12	By May, [Student Name] will be able to hold a fluent 5-10 minute conversation in Spanish with a native Spanish speaker.

Grade	Goal
1-2	In order to be more confident when speaking in front of my peers. I will be producing and presenting more projects in front of my peers. I will collaborate with my teacher to find many ways that enable me to speak in front of them. I will practice presenting in front of my peers at least once each nine weeks.
