ASKING THE RIGHT QUESTIONS...

- Is art your child's only passion or do they have other interests?
- How competitive is your child?
- How does stress affect your child?
- Are they self-motivated?
- Do you as parents support the decision to pursue an arts major?
- Where does your child fit in the "pond" they are currently in? (Big Fish or small fish?)
- Have they participated in any local, regional, or All-State events/competitions/ensembles?
- Do they participate in arts activities during the summer?
- Have private teachers, school instructors, etc. given your child encouragement to continue on in their art?
- Can your child see themselves doing anything else?

- Traditional College vs. Conservatory
- Public vs. Private
- Urban vs. Rural (Proximity to Arts Center)
- Campus size
- Auditions/Portfolio Review Required?
- o Degree Options-BA, BM, BFA, etc.
- Majors, minors, and double-majors
- Cost (Types of Financial Aid Available)
- Program Faculty Experience
- Networking, Internships, and other built-in opportunities
- Flexibility within the specific program

Elements of the Application

- Academic Requirements
- Standardized Tests
- Essays and Recommendations (Artist Statements)
- Extra-Curricular Activities & Community Service
- Artistic Evaluation

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Maintain solid grades in **BOTH** academic and artistic courses
- Students must be admitted to both the institution AND the artistic program
- Some of the best arts programs are connected to Top-Tier universities with selective admissions criteria (Carnegie-Mellon, UCLA, USC, NYU, Northwestern, University of Michigan etc.)
- Conservatories are less focused on grades
- Goals are to have the WIDEST range of possibilities available

STANDARDIZED TESTS

- Role of testing (great equalizer)
- Types of tests: PSAT, SAT, ACT, SAT Subject Tests
- Which to take?
 - ACT vs SAT
 - SAT Subject Tests
- When to take these tests?
- Preparation
 - READ!! READ!!! READ!!
 - Take rigorous courses!
 - Khan Academy and College Board
 - Outside tutors and classes-Worth the Money???
 - PSAT Results-January

EXTRA-CURRICULAR & COMMUNITY SERVICE

- Consistency and Commitment
 - Start early and build a legacy of work with specific relevant organizations/causes
 - Less is More-Fewer groups with more depth of involvement is much more important than being involved in MANY clubs and organizations
- o Leadership
- Community not just school
 - Very important for selective colleges
 - Find ways to be involved in outside organizations in some way
- Maintain Balance

ESSAYS, SUPPLEMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Grades, test scores, activities are often the baseline for consideration.
- Always do an Arts Supplement if offered, even if not pursuing an arts major!
- Essays and letters are what make an applicant special
 personal connection.
- Essays
 - Student voice
 - Start early & think about opportunities for subject matter
 - Review prompts for ideas
 - Build relationships with teachers and counselors
 - Choose wisely-Someone who truly knows the student!

ARTISTIC EVALUATION

- Primary consideration for top arts programs
- Audition process varies from program to program
 - Live
 - Digital Submissions
 - Pre-Screen Video Recording
- Artist Statements
- Body of Work
- Take advantage of every opportunity available
 - On-Campus (club, competition, all-school activities)
 - Off-Campus (community, summer programs, competitions)

More on Pre-Screen/Portfolio Process

- Becoming more and more standard every year
- Saves time/money during the senior year by reducing travel to live auditions
- Things to Remember for Video/Recordings
 - Plan the Shoot/Know the Requirements
 - Apply and Reapply Make Up if Filming
 - Pay Attention to Background, Lighting and Sound
 - Don't over Film (limit to three takes)
 - Direct Focus vs. Off-Camera Focus
 - Establish Physical Parameters
 - Be Mindful of Framing Specifics & Requirements
 - Don't forget the Pre-Screen Supplemental Essays

- Start Early-Build a body of work and develop skills
- Elementary & Middle School-Explore interest and develop foundational skills in music and dance.
- 9th/10th Lay a strong foundation/learn about options
- 11th Begin to narrow your college list based on the student (not their friends)
- 12th Finalize your list-Apply and Audition
- Enlist support from knowledgeable resources
- Encourage participation in off-campus & summer arts activities and opportunities
- Promote a balance between arts, academics, & social activities
- Dream big but find an affordable option
