Department of State Health Services (DSHS)

Overview

The <u>DSHS</u> offers 2 programs specifically for families of children with disabilities or special health care needs. The DSHS also oversees other programs, including <u>disease</u> prevention, <u>Emergency Medical Services (EMS) certification</u>, <u>health care professional licensing</u>, and <u>birth certificates</u>.

Key Services for Students with Disabilities

<u>Mental Health Services</u> are provided by 37 local mental health authorities across the state. These include:

- Crisis Services
- o Adult Mental Health
- o Children's Mental Health
- Adult Substance Abuse
- Youth Substance Abuse

<u>Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) Services</u> helps children under the age of 21 with special health care needs. The child must have a medical problem that has physical symptoms (this means the program does not cover clients with solely a mental, behavioral, or emotional condition or a delay in development).
