ATTENTION:

It is required that you must download and read the FBISD Handbook and Elkins Handbook found on the Elkins website cheer page. These documents state what is required of Elkins cheerleaders and disciplinary guidelines set not only by the district, but by the school as well. By reading the documents candidates and candidates parents understand what is expected before trying out.

Try-Out Dates

Below are the dates for the try-out process.

- Informational Parent Meeting: Must attend ONE
 - Wednesday, February 23, 2022
 - @ 4:45 on Zoom
 - @ 6:30 in the Elkins Library
 - o Monday, February 28, 2022
 - @ 5:00 on Zoom
- Tryout Clinic: Wednesday, March 2ND –March 3RD @6:30-8:30 in the Competition Gym (EHS)
 - o All candidates will learn the tryout dance and cheer. At the tryout clinic, we will only go over the tryout dance and cheer. Any other skills needed for tryouts will be shown, but not taught.
- Mock Tryout: Friday, March 4th @ 6:30 in the Competition gym (EHS)
 - All candidates should attend in order to receive their tryout number and go through the
 tryout process. Candidates will be given a score sheet that the judges will use on the actual
 tryout date.

• Elkins Tryout: Monday, March 7th @Elkins High School)

Please note:

These costs are <u>estimates</u>. After the fitting, you will receive an updated total with amounts owed. State sales tax will be added to clothing items.

- Your child will be permitted to keep all items that you purchase. All other items will be returned at the end of the season (i.e.: school issued uniforms, megaphones, school issued pink out attire). Your child is monetarily responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of their school-owned equipment. They must pay for anything that must be replaced.
- Each girl will receive an invoice for the costs listed above. Payments can be made in full or in installments.
- Miscellaneous items may be added to the initial costs as the year continues (i.e. spirit shirts, sweatshirts, pink out bloomers, etc.); all extra items will be announced well in advance.

How Does It Work?

Tryout Process and Procedures

In order to try out...

- Candidate must turn in all paperwork by *March 2nd 202*2. This includes: parent signature agreement, candidate release/medical information form, parent permission form, and copy of first and second nine weeks report card. All other paperwork must be completed online. (This includes: acknowledgment of rules, UIL Steroid Use and Testing Form, concussion acknowledgement form, original athletic physical signed by a doctor, medical history form, Fort Bend Emergency Form, Fort Bend athletic policies. To find the online and physical forms, go to the Fort Bend website, click on the athletics link, and select the online forms link to the left).
- * Candidate cannot have *more than two* F's (grades), N's or U's (conduct), or **out of compliance with attendance laws** on his/her report card through the second nine weeks period.
- * If I do not receive ALL of the candidate's paperwork, the candidate will be in jeopardy of not being able to tryout. It is important that every piece of paperwork is, filled out correctly and turned in on time.

Physical appearance at tryouts....

- * You must wear a plain white T-shirt (*not tight or see-through*), light-colored sports bra, royal blue shorts (*not short or tight*), bloomers, plain white socks and tennis shoes or cheer shoes.
- * You must put your hair in a neat ponytail. You may **not** wear a bow in your hair.
- * You must remove all jewelry (including all piercings) and fingernail polish.
- * You may wear everyday make-up (no competition make-up).

On March 7th ...

- * Arrive at Elkins High School by **4:00 pm** to warm up and stretch. Enter through the student parking lot door in Gold Hall. Tryouts will begin at 4:45.
- * You will pin your number to your shirt.
- * All cheer candidates must stay at Elkins until everyone has performed. Candidates will wait in the commons when they are not trying out.
- * You must stay until the end in case a tie breaker is needed, leaving early could cause you to forfeit your spot.
- * *Tryouts are closed to the public*. Only candidates, senior captains, coaches, judges, and impartial tabulators are allowed in Elkins.
- * Once tryouts are over, all candidates must leave Elkins.
- * The results will be posted on the front doors of Elkins High School Thursday March 10 at 2:45, and March 11 on Twitter and Instagram.

What Should I Expect?

Being a EHS Cheerleader

- * Elkins cheerleaders work hard. The squads train to avoid injury and keep in shape. Weekly workouts will include, but are not limited to, circuit training, yoga, strength training, and more.. Appropriate clothing is required at all times—which includes proper undergarments, socks, and cheer shoes. Please see the EHS cheer by-laws for more details.
- * Elkins cheerleaders practice schedule will vary. On average, practice will be held three days after school. After-school practices are mandatory, as we review cheers, hang signs, practice jumps, tumbling, and stunting.
- * Elkins cheerleaders are a team. If one person is absent, it affects the entire squad. We try to avoid excessive absences. Absences during the week of a pep rally will not be tolerated, as all participating cheerleaders are necessary to execute a successful pep rally.
- * Elkins cheerleaders notify their coaches *prior* to an absence, not the day of the absence.
- * Elkins cheerleaders understand that **outside cheerleading** or **after-school jobs** are not excuses for missing a game or practice. Elkins cheerleading always comes first!
- * Elkins cheerleaders do more than cheer at games. They also decorate hallways, paint signs, host pep rallies, and volunteer in the community. All cheerleaders are expected to participate in these activities.
- * Elkins cheerleaders are part of a year-long sport. They promote and facilitate pride and school spirit. Their job is not easy, but each member of the team works hard and supports each other. **ALL cheerleaders must be enrolled in the cheer class for the entire year**. The only exceptions to this rule will be seniors, who have **previously** participated in another Varsity sport.
- * Elkins cheerleaders understand that they represent their student body at all times, on or off campus. They know that their behavior is to be respectable and a positive representation of a young adult in public, on-line, and at school.
- * Elkins cheerleaders have read, understood, and follow the FBISD Cheerleading Handbook and the FBISD student athletic handbook.

What Happens If I Make It?

Dates to Remember

- * A mandatory parent meeting will also be held on Tuesday, April 5th at 5:30 p.m. for all parents to discuss the upcoming cheer season. The first payment is April 5th. Payments can be made via RevTrak You are responsible for making arrangements to bring your payment to Elkins if your child does not currently attend school here.
- * A clothes fitting and meeting of the squad will also be held Tuesday, April 5th at 6:15 pm. All cheerleaders must attend. We will also discuss spring and summer schedule. Please understand that the parent meeting and fitting are separate. There are no parents allowed at the fitting.
- * We plan to attend camp the last week of July. This includes members who are currently at another campus.

Monday, May 9th - after school practice starts (Mandatory practice will be held every Monday and Wednesday in the month of from May 9 through May 25 from 4:45-6:15.)

Last week of July - Per district policy, if your cheerleader does not attend camp, they will be removed from the squad. You will not receive a refund on any monies paid.

August – November: Football Season! Do not make weekend plans before seeing the football schedule. In addition, be prepared to work especially hard the week before and of Homecoming.

December – March: Basketball Season

Transportation

Each cheerleader is responsible for getting herself to every in-district game and practices on-time. Transportation will only be provided to out-of-district games and playoff games. Please make sure your daughter has a ride and is on-time to all games and practices. Your daughter is ultimately responsible and will face consequences for being late or not being able to go based on a lack of or undependable transportation.

Be supportive of your cheerleader.

This year will be strenuous on your cheerleader and usually on your schedule, as well. Support your cheerleader knowing that cheering develops cooperative skills, respect for others, and leadership skills that wouldn't otherwise be refined.

If your child makes the cheerleading squad, please don't forget to be added to the distribution list for updates and important e-mails. Email your child's coach.

Most communication about cheerleading will be via email or be handled/told to the cheerleaders directly. Please check your email regularly as communication is key!

I understand that I am financially responsible for the items required for the Elkins Cheer
Team, and that fees may change. I understand that I am responsible for the fees even if circumstances
require my child to be removed or withdrawn from the cheer squad at any point in the year.
I understand that camp is a district requirement.
I understand that he/she is required to attend all events/practices. All events AND practices an
mandatory unless otherwise stated.
I understand that dates and times may change and my cheerleader is still expected to attend.
The coach will give as much advanced notice as possible.
I understand that the 2022-2023 season begins at the announcement of making the team and
all demerits will begin being tabulated at that time for the 2022-2023 season. This includes excused
absences.
I understand that playoffs for EHS sports teams are mandatory.
I understand that he/she is responsible for participating in all fundraising activities coordinate
by the coaches.
I understand that he/she must currently be currently eligible according to UIL standards and
cannot have more than two failing or incomplete grades or unsatisfactory or poor marks in conduct to
try out.
I understand that competitive cheer and work are unexcused absences and that the
responsibilities of a cheerleader and a mascot are considered at all times more important than other
extra-curricular activities and/or an after-school job.
I understand that other school activities, doctor appointments, and illnesses count towards
excused absences (Please see Fort Bend ISD Cheerleading Handbook for questions).
I understand that my child's academic and discipline record affects his/her ability to try out.
I grant the release of legal responsibility of my son/daughter to Fort Bend ISD and the Elkins
cheerleading coaches while on any project or activity concerning cheerleading responsibilities.
I will show good sportsmanship by accepting the decision of the judges; scores and the final
results of tryouts.
I understand that after three benches have been received, a meeting will be held in order to
determine the corrective action. I also understand that a cheerleader may be removed after the fourth
bench is received. I understand that if I miss an event, i.e. football game, I will receive a bench and
may be required to make-up the event the following week at another team's game (i.e. varsity girl wil
cheer with the JV squad). I understand it is the coach's decision to choose the game. If I miss a
practice, receive a consequence from a teacher, I will be benched at the next event (i.e. pep-rally,
game, etc.) and will have to sit out (abiding by same rules as girls cheering).

I understand that all rules are the same for every cheerleader in the program, and no exceptions
will be made. I understand that as a cheerleader, I am a representative of Elkins High School and must
follow all school rules and regulations, as well as the FBISD code of conduct.
I understand that if I am placed on the varsity team with an 'attempted skill' such as an
'attempted tuck' performed at tryouts, I am required to continue training on my own time. I will
receive training from an outside source on my own time to ensure the tuck is acquired by August 2 nd .
During the summer, I understand that I will be required to show progression during my training. I
understand that in not doing my part to obtain that skill, I can be removed from portions of certain
routines (i.e. pep- rallies, competition, homecoming show).
I am also aware that I need to maintain, as well as improve, my tumbling skills and basic
cheerleading techniques which may require outside training.
I understand that any disrespect to my coaches, other coaches, teammates, other teams,
administrators, school and game officials, etc. will not be tolerated at any time, and if I demonstrate
any type of disrespect, I understand there will be consequences for my actions, which may
include immediate suspension.
