

Welcome to Cornerstone Elementary,

I hope that this letter finds you well and ready for a great 2025-2026 school year! I am looking forward to working with you to make sure that this year is safe and healthy for our CSE Chameleons.

The clinic is in the main corridor of the school, next to the front office. If at any time, you would like to discuss the health of your child, please do not hesitate to contact me.

If your student has a medical condition or food/other allergy, please bring this to our attention and complete the appropriate forms that may be found on the FBISD website under the Parents & Students tab.

Here are a few reminders as we start the school year:

Immunizations - If your child has received updated immunizations, please bring in or send a copy to me at the email address below. Specific immunizations are required prior to Kindergarten and 7th grade. Information may be found on the FBISD website under the Parents & Students tab.

Medications - If your child requires administration of daily or as-needed medications during school hours, please complete and return the required forms. It is preferred that medications and forms are turned in at the same time.

Please note: Medication Authorization Forms are active for the current school year only. All forms, whether for prescription or over the counter medications, need to be signed by the physician. The medication must be in the original container and delivered by an ADULT to the nurse's office.

Some students may be able to carry their own inhalers and epi-pens with required consent. A separate form is required for each medication.

Illness and Fever - On occasion, your child may need to stay home from school due to illness. Following a bout of vomiting, diarrhea or fever, your student should stay home and be observed for further symptoms. Fever is defined as a temperature of 100.0 or above. Your student should be fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications before they return to school. The same applies to vomiting and diarrhea. Please make sure that your information is always up to date in SKYWARD. This is very useful if your child becomes ill at school.

You will be contacted to pick your child up from school for the following reasons:

- Temperature of 100.0 or greater within the past 24hrs
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Undetermined rash, this will require clearance from MD to return to school
- Feeling too ill/too much pain to remain in school

Bathroom and recess accidents happen and so do lunch spills. Please pack an extra pair of weather appropriate clothes in your student's backpack.
