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

The library has been a busy place this year and I want to give a special thanks to all of our wonderful library volunteers who help out...Thank you, you are ALL amazing!!!

Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students have been busy reading and voting for their favorite Bluebonnet books in the library. SWE students who read 5 or more of the 20 nominated Bluebonnet books voted for their favorite book this January. SWE students were part of 150,094 students in the state of Texas that participated in choosing this year's award winning book. And....This year's winner is *Roller Girl by Victoria Jamieson* with 18,481 votes. This book also won the Newbery Book Honor Award in 2016.

Texas Reader's Club is also in full swing. Students need to continue reading and completing projects for eligibility. Please check with your child's teacher for grade level requirements. Remember all books need to be read and recorded in the Texas Readers Folder by the first Friday in May.

The different grade levels are also busy learning in the library. Here is just a small look at some of the things we are learning.

- **Kindergarten** students are learning how to choose books and they are also listening to quality literature. **First** graders have been learning about the features of fiction and non-fiction books and pairing fiction with non-fiction books with the same topics.
- Second grade students have learned how to use the catalog and put books on hold.
- Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students have been busy reading Bluebonnet nominated books and other award winning books as well as going to library stations.

Tips for test day

Good news: Everyday strategies your youngster uses in reading and math will come in handy on standardized tests. Here's how:

- Help your child prepare for sections where she has to read paragraphs, answer questions, and give supporting details. When you read to her at home, talk about the book, and ask her to show you *evidence* to back up her ideas and opinions.
- Your youngster may be asked to show how she solves math problems during the
 test, just like she does on regular assignments. Tell her that it's better to write too
 much rather than not enough, especially if the test isn't timed. She might also
 include drawings, such as a sketch showing how she found the area of a trapezoid.
