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Dear Parents,

News From The Library

The SWE library is a very busy place. We had a very successful November book fair, and our success is largely due to wonderful parent and student volunteers. Although book fair only runs for one week, it takes several weeks to prepare, and I want to thank all those who helped make our fair so successful, especially our book fair volunteers and the 5th grade VISA student helpers! Our second book fair this school year will be the week of March 5th-9th with set-up on March Ist.

In December the library hosted author Hal Evans and the students were treated to a day of hearing him perform and discuss poetry. The students enjoyed his first book of poetry, If I Weren't Me.

The different grade levels are also busy learning in the library. Here is just a small look at some of the things we are learning during library classes. All students learn about internet safety in the library and participate in various library stations. Some of the various library stations are research, geography, Bluebonnet book reading, and puzzles & patterns. Specifically, the kindergarten students are learning how to choose books, and are listening to quality literature. First grade students are accessing Tumblebooks and PebbleGo, two of the District's digital resources, where they are listening to and reading books on the computer as well as learning about research. They are also learning about the features of non-fiction books and comparing fiction and non-fiction. Second grade students are learning how a library works and are learning how to search and read an online database using the library catalog. Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students have been listening to book talks, using the online catalog, participating in library stations and learning about the internet.

In addition to preparing for and having a successful book fair, learning about databases, and the internet, over 10,000 books have been circulated in our library this year. Wow...we have great readers!!

We have a lot to look forward to over the next few months. The 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students are busy reading Bluebonnet nominated books and the students in those grades who read five or more of the 20 nominated books will be eligible to vote for the state's winner at the end of January. Voting will take place in the library and we will announce the winner as soon as we know!

As a reminder, your child participates in one of the following 55 minute outclasses everyday: PE, Art, Library, or Music. Students are on a four-day rotation which means they go to a different outclass every 4 days. Since students do not have an assigned day for library, it is important to have a system in place so that their library books are at school on library day. One way to help remember the outclass order is to learn the acronym: P.A.L.M. (PE, ART, Library, Music). Another suggestion is to have students keep library books in their backpack when they are not reading them so that they will always have them at school to read or return. SWE students should be checking out books every time they come to library and returning them on time so others can enjoy them too. Thanks for everything you do to encourage reading at home and school!


