Dear Parent/Guardian,

As educators, we understand student mental health plays a key role in their ability to succeed in school. Fort Bend ISD is committed to working with you, not only in the academic education of your child, but also to ensure students reach their full potential socially and emotionally.

Each year, we provide students an opportunity to share their thoughts, feelings and social/emotional needs using a Needs Assessment. It is our priority to ensure students have timely, responsive, and effective social and emotional support continuously throughout the school year. The Needs Assessment allows us to recognize and respond to students' social/emotional needs as well as promote the wellness and development for all students.

The Needs Assessment addresses the following areas:

- Social/Emotional supports
- Sense of belonging
- Safety
- Post-secondary readiness

The Needs Assessment may pinpoint a concern, offering us the ability to secure additional assistance for students. This means that the assessment results may be shared with targeted campus and district staff if the assessment results reveal a potential concern. All assessment results will be kept confidential, stored separately from academic records.

Townewest Elementary will make the Needs Assessment available to students using **Microsoft Forms** from October 18th to October 29th. Prior to its release, students will receive information about the Needs Assessment from their school counseling staff.

Transportation Changes

At the beginning of the year, your child's homeroom teacher will ask you how your child will be going home each day. If any changes occur throughout the year, you will need to send a "Change of Transportation" letter signed and dated to school prior to the change. For the safety of your child, we can only accept notes signed by parent/guardian or an email from the parent/guardian (Emails must be received from an email address on file in Family Access). Your change of transportation can be sent to <u>attendancetwe@fortbendisd.com</u> **NO Phone Calls Will Be Accepted**. In an emergency, you may fax your letter to 281-634-4494 before **2:00 pm** on the day of the change. <u>Transportation changes CANNOT be accepted</u> over the phone. Exceptions will be only cleared through an administrator. We cannot accept changes to transportation after **2:00 pm**. Also, if you need to check out your child for any reason, please do so <u>no</u> later **2:45 p.m**.

Early Leave

Parents/Guardians picking up a student prior to the end of the school day must show a valid government-issued photo identification, sign the student out and wait in the designated area for the student. **The child will not be released to anyone except the parent/guardian unless a written note from the parent/guardian with a signature has been received.** A student needing to leave during the school day for appointments should remain in the classroom to maximize instructional time until the parent/guardian arrive(s). School personnel will inform the student that the parent/guardian has arrived.

Students who are not present for the 10:00 a.m. roll call will be marked absent for the day, unless they have a healthcare provider excuse. No early pickups will be allowed after 2:45 pm. Please help the front office by **minimizing** early pick-ups unless there is an emergency. Students being picked up early on a consistent basis without significant cause will be referred to the Attendance Committee and District Social Worker for truancy.

The American Academy of Pediatrics on Monday, July 19, 2021 recommended **that all children over the age of two wear masks when returning to school this year**, regardless of vaccination status. The AAP, which said it is important for children to return to in-person learning this year, recommends that school staff also wear masks.

Campus Visitors

Fort Bend ISD will allow all visitors on campus for the 2021-2022 school year. Campuses will communicate their visitor guidelines to their school community. Visitor guidelines may vary per campus due to campus utilization and unique needs. Please contact your campus principal for information and procedures about attending on-campus events.

All visitors must present a valid photo ID at the front office when signing in prior to being approved to access the learning environment.

By entering a District facility, all visitors will confirm they do not have COVID-19 symptoms and have not tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 10 days.

Parents we need your help during **morning arrival** to ensure the safety of your children. We have procedures in place to assist with keeping our students safe but those procedures only work if parents adhere to the procedures.

- 1. Please follow the flow of the car rider traffic;
 - Have your child/children ready to pop-out of the car:
- Have all their school items with them
- Have all items in the backpack and zipped
- Have their mask on when the car door opens

- Say your good-byes before the car door opens
- Share your good-bye kisses before the car door opens
- 3. Do not park in the staff parking lot our staff need those spots when they arrive to work;
- 4. Do not park on the side of the street to drop of your child/children;
- 5. If you are walking your child to school, that means you are walking from home; not parking in front of the school and walking to the door;
- 6. Arrival time is 8:10 AM and
- 7. Breakfast is 7:30 AM 8:00 AM.

When parents change the dismissal procedures, other parents are not happy because it is skipping the line.

It is extremely hot outside for the staff and we are working to get all our students to breakfast and class on time but we need parents to help us.

Parents we also need your help during **dismissal** to ensure the safety of your children. We have procedures in place to assist with keeping our students safe but those procedures only work if parents adhere to the procedures.

- 1. Have your car tag visible in the window until your child/children are in the car;
- 2. When you do not have the car rider please have your ID;
- 3. Follow the flow of the car rider line (we only have 1 line);
- 4. Do NOT park on the side of the street to pick-up your child/children;
- 5. If your child/children is a walker that means they are walking home or you are walking to campus to pick them up (no car is involved when the student is a walker) and
- 6. Dismissal time is 3:25 PM please be present and on time.

Morning Arrival

- Parents are not allowed to park in the staff parking lot and walk students to the door.
- Please drop your child off at one of the cones during morning arrival.
- Do not drop your child off on the side of the street.
- The front of the building are designated for bus and day care ONLY.

After-School Dismissal

Attention Townewest Walkers if you have indicated that your student is a walker please see information below:

- If the student is in grade third, fourth and fifth they will walk home or you can meet them at the stop sign. Do **NOT** come to campus.
- If a student is in grade, third, fourth and fifth with a sibling in grades Pre-Kinder, Kindergarten, First Grade and Second Grade, they will walk home with the older sibling or you can meet them at the stop sign. Do **NOT** come to campus.
- If your student is in Pre-Kinder, Kindergarten, First Grade and Second Grade without an older sibling to walk home with, you must meet them near to picnic area with your car tag as a form of identification.
- Do not park in front of the school to walk on campus to pick-up your student. A walker is a student walking home or the parent walking to pick-up the student.
- If you drive and park, you will need to make your child a car rider.
- All car rider parents please follow the traffic flow; do not cut the line; do not block the driveways
 of our school neighbors and please be kind!
