In-School Pencil/Paper Exam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide a test setting that students are most familiar with; students may return to previous questions on exam; and least likely to have complications with submitting exam in person • In-person testing administrator for additional test logistic support • If schools must close for safety reasons, campuses can authorize students to take exams during at-home digital exam. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Because it will be the first administered exam date for the course, the student will have less time to prepare than at-home digital options
Digital Exam	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allows for additional time to prepare • 2021 AP digital exams have been designed with security in mind. Digital exams will not include questions that can be answered with internet searches, textbooks, notes, study guides, or similar material, it will include security features to prevent students from collaborating, accessing unauthorized aids, or attempting to have someone else test for the, and be reviewed with plagiarism detection software and other monitors and post-exam analyses for detecting exam violations. • Digital exams will be accessible to students with disabilities who are approved for testing accommodations. Detailed information about accommodations for digital exams will be available in early March. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students will not have the ability to go back to previous questions; must provide a final answer to the question at time it is asked. • Concerns always exist with submitting work digitally- risk of power or internet failure • Exam start time will need to be adjusted to Eastern Time zone. • Because the full-length digital AP Exams require typewritten responses in the free-response section, the exams can't be taken on smartphones or tablets. Laptops and desktop computers are the sole format. • For Chemistry, Physics, Calculus and Statistics: the exam could require the use of symbols in student responses that are not located on a traditional keyboard and will require locating the symbol within the exam application to input. <p>For Administration Window 2:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only allows for 1 additional make-up for conflicts or disruptions • Could potentially conflict with FBISD senior activities (see campus calendar for more information) <p>For Administration Window 3:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Does not allow for additional make-up dates for conflicts or disruptions • Conflicts with FBISD final exam schedule, graduations ceremonies, and extends into summer break.
