Fort Bend ISD's Music Education Program Receives National Recognition for the 11th Consecutive Year



Fort Bend Independent School District has been honored with the Best Communities for Music Education designation from The NAMM Foundation for its outstanding commitment to music education.

Now in its 21<sup>st</sup> year, the Best Communities for Music Education designation is awarded to districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement in efforts to provide music access and education to all students. To qualify for the Best Communities designation, Fort Bend ISD answered detailed questions about funding, graduation requirements, music class participation, instruction time, facilities, and support for the music programs. Responses were verified with school officials and reviewed by The Music Research Institute at the University of Kansas.

"The Arts, including Music, are an essential part of the FBISD curriculum. Music plays an integral part in educating the whole child and cultivating the attributes described in the District's *Profile of a Graduate*," said FBISD Director of Fine Arts, James Drew. "Receiving the Best Communities for Music Education designation for the eleventh consecutive year affirms the quality of our District's music education programs and supports the FBISD Fine Arts Department mission of inspiring artistry and equipping all students to reach their full potential, thus creating opportunities without boundaries."

This award recognizes that FBISD is leading the way with learning opportunities as outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The legislation guides implementation in the states and replaces the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB), which was often criticized for an overemphasis on testing-while leaving behind subjects such as music. ESSA recommends music and the arts as important elements of a well-rounded education for all children.

All-State is the highest honor a Texas music student can receive. 1,795 students are selected through a process that began with over 66,800 students from around the state vying for this honor to perform in one of 15 ensembles (bands, orchestras, and choirs). Only the top 2.6% of musicians who initially audition become All-State musicians. Texas Music Educators Association, an association of over 13,500 school music educators dedicated to promoting excellence in music education, sponsors the Texas All-State competition. These All-State students participate in three days of rehearsals directed by nationally recognized conductors during the TMEA Clinic/Convention. Their performances for thousands of attendees bring this extraordinary event to a close. The 2020 convention was even more distinct because TMEA is celebrating 100 years as a music educators association.

# New Piano Technician Program at Thurgood Marshall High School



The Fine Arts Department would like to share exciting news about a new opportunity recently approved by the FBISD Board of Trustees starting this fall: the Piano Technician Certification Program, the first of its kind in any high school in the nation!

In this innovative program of choice, students will develop the necessary skills to work as a professional piano tuner or piano technician upon graduation. Piano technicians tune, repair, and regulate pianos (adjust the timbre of the strings) at concert venues, as well as colleges and universities. Due to a lack of training programs, these professionals are in great demand across the world. The starting salary for a piano tuner is \$45,000 and piano technicians earn \$60,000+ annually. There are no gender or physical limitations for piano tuners and piano technicians beyond the ability to use hand tools and distinguish pitch. Students wishing to pursue a career in music can use their piano tuner/technician skills to pay for their college education.

The Piano Technician program will be housed and taught at Marshall High School as a series of four oneyear courses to any interested FBISD high school students. Students will earn high school credit as well as two industry certifications upon high school graduation and may pursue post-secondary training and certification as a Master Piano Technician at the University of Houston. There are opportunities for additional training and apprenticeships through piano retailers and manufacturers. *FBISD Department of Fine Arts is proud to offer this first-of-a-kind Piano Technician Program!* 

## **FBISD String Fling 2020**



The Fine Arts Department hosted its annual String Fling Concerts on February 5 and 6 in the Wheeler Field House. The February 5, 2020 event showcased over 450 beginning orchestra students from six FBISD Middle Schools: Baines, Crockett; First Colony; Fort Settlement; Garcia, Missouri City; and Sugar Land. On Thursday, February 6, 2020, the event highlighted another 450 beginning orchestra students from seven additional FBISD Middle Schools: James Bowie; Dulles; Hodges Bend; Lake Olympia; Quail Valley; Sartartia; and Ronald Thornton. This year's String Fling guest performers were Alexa Thomson, violist, and David Connor, double bassist, both Community-Embedded Musicians with the Houston Symphony. Ms. Thomson and Mr. Conner have appeared as guest performers at the FBISD String Fling in previous years.

FBISD Choirs Perform at State and Regional Music Conferences



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Fort Bend ISD choral programs earn national recognition at two prestigious music conferences, the Texas Music Educators Association and the Southwestern Division of the American Choral Directors Association. The *Clements HS Varsity Mixed Choir* and the *Clements HS Chorale Women*, under the direction of Janet Menzie and Ryan Bogner, and the *Garcia MS Varsity Women's Choir*, under the direction of Kelsey Appleby, were the first FBISD Choirs to earn this distinction. The groups were selected through a competitive blind-audition process for the privilege to perform for these esteemed professional music conferences.

The *Clements High School Varsity Mixed Choir* performed brilliantly on their Valentine's Day concert at the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center in San Antonio during the Centennial Texas Music Educators Association (TMEA) convention in February 2020. TMEA is the premier conference for music education in the United States with an attendance of over 31,000 teachers, students, parents, and members of the music industry. Clements performed for a full capacity audience and received a resounding standing ovation for their stellar performance.

In addition to this honor, two FBISD choirs performed for an audience of choral directors at the 2020 Southwestern American Choral Directors Association conference in Little Rock, Arkansas just prior to Spring Break in March 2020. The *Garcia Middle School Varsity Women's Choir*performed on the opening concert session and the *Clements High School Chorale Women* performed on the Friday afternoon concert session in the beautiful Robinson Center Performance Hall. Both choirs gave exceptional performances and received well-deserved standing ovations.

The *Garcia Middle School Varsity Women's Choir*performed an eclectic program in four languages which reflected the diversity of the GMS choirs. Their performance was accompanied by GMS Band Director, Ms. Nicole Elias, on recorder and featured twin orchestra students, Lena and Lucy Tran, who are GMS alumni and are members of the Austin High School Orchestras. Kelsey Appleby has been the Head Choir Director at Garcia MS since the fall of 2014.

The *Clements High School Chorale Women* featured the premiere performance of *I Count It All Joy* written by nationally renowned composer, Jocelyn Hagen. The composition is dedicated to the memory of the director's daughter, Heather Michelle Menzie (1991-2015) and was commissioned by the FBISD Department of Fine Arts for this performance. Janet Menzie has been the Head Choir Director at Clements HS since the fall of 2016, and Ryan Bogner has been the Assistant Choir Director at Clements HS since the fall of 2017.

# **UIL Middle School Choir Contest Results**

Forty Middle School Choirs from FBISD competed at UIL Region 13 Middle School Choral Concert & Sight Reading Evaluation held March 4 through 6 at Christ Church in Sugar Land. Twenty-one MS Choirs earned Sweepstakes Awards for First Division (Superior) Ratings in Concert and Sight Reading along with an additional nine choirs earning First Division Plaques in either Concert or Sight Reading and six choirs earned a Second Division (Excellent) rating in Concert or Sight Reading or both.

The second dedicated Music Teacher positions will be at Commonwealth, Cornerstone, Drabek, Heritage Rose, Holley, Leonetti, Madden, Neill, Oakland, Oyster Creek, Patterson, Scanlan Oaks, Schiff, Settlers Way, Sienna Crossing, Sullivan and Walker Station Elementary Schools. The second dedicated Visual Arts Teacher positions will be at Commonwealth, Cornerstone, Heritage Rose, Leonetti, Neill, Sienna Crossing and Sullivan Elementary Schools. We are so excited for this wonderful opportunity to improve Fine Arts education at the Elementary level.

#### **Tommy Tune Nominations**

The Tommy Tune Awards Program celebrates the educational value, artistry, and community of high school musical theatre in the Greater Houston area through adjudication, healthy competition, and creative programming. This program offers an opportunity for students and educators to share their creative accomplishments while instilling in young people the value of engaging in the performing arts as a lifelong pursuit. Every year, Houston area High Schools produce a full-length musical in order to compete in 15 categories: Leading Actor, Leading Actress, Supporting Actor, Supporting Actress, Featured Performer, Ensemble, Scenic Design, Lighting Design, Costume Design, Stage Crew & Technical Execution, Orchestra, Musical Direction, Choreography, Direction, and Overall Best Musical. Each school is adjudicated by a team of volunteer Adjudicators who are professional Houston-based performers, directors, designers, musicians, arts educators, etc. Productions are evaluated in each category based on a 100 point scale rubric. This process runs from October to March, and the top scores are nominated and announced mid-March.

## **Dance DEAL Assessment Results**

The Texas Dance Educators Association or TDEA is dedicated to promoting quality dance education across the state of Texas. As part of that dedication, TDEA sponsors the Dance Educators Assessment of Learning. The purpose of DEAL is to identify exemplary dance practices aligned with the state TEKS to promote student achievement and success in the Art of Dance Education. The information gained through participation in DEAL will help educators design best practices to implement within their dance programs to enhance student learning and progress in the art of dance.

How does DEAL work? Dance 1 students participate in an adjudicated learning process working new choreography in front of a panel of judges much like the sight-reading component of UIL Music evaluations. The breakdown of a DEAL assessment includes:

1. Students and teacher learn level appropriate technique-based choreography from the DEAL Instructing Choreographer.

- 2. The campus dance director works with their students on the new choreography.
- 3. Students present the practiced combination to the Adjudicators without their director.
- 4. Students and director receive written/oral Adjudicator feedback on all sections immediately.
- 5. The assessment is a total of 45 minutes.

All FBISD high school dance programs completed the DEAL assessment process prior to Spring Break in March and 10 of our 11 campuses earned a Division 1 rating, the highest designation possible. Congratulations to all of the amazing students and directors on this significant accomplishment.
