Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 Paid Meal Equity

- Mandates paid meal price increase annually
 - Objective
 - Paid Price + Paid Reimbursement equals
 Free Reimbursement Rate
- Waiver
 - Fund balance equals three months
 - Price increase would result in excess fund balance exceeding three months
 - FBISD waiver application to be completed this summer

Texas Education Code §33.901; ≥80% free & reduced mandated by law; FBISD has four qualified campuses:

- Ridgegate

NEW PROGRAM REGULATIONS 2014-2015

Fundraising and A La Carte Sales

(Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010)

- Implementation date: July 1, 2014
- No exempt fundraisers in the State of Texas (Texas Department of Agriculture)
- All fundraising shall meet new standards



Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 Fundraising & A La Carte Sales 2014-2015

The law specifies that the nutrition standards shall apply to <u>all</u> <u>foods sold</u>:

- outside the school meal programs
- on the school campus; and
- at any time during the school day
- school day is the period from the midnight before, to 30 minutes after the end of the official school day



Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 Fundraising & A La Carte Sales 2014-2015

The law specifies that the nutrition standards shall apply to <u>all</u> <u>foods sold</u>:

- A la carte in the cafeteria
- In school stores
- Snack bars
- Vending Machines
- All other venues on campus





Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 Fundraising & A La Carte Sales 2014-2015

WHAT ARE COMPETITIVE FOODS?

Competitive food:

All food and beverages sold to students on the school campus during the school day, other than those meals reimbursable under programs authorized by the National School Lunch Act and the Child Nutrition Act.

HOW DO COMPETITIVE FOODS QUALIFY?

To be allowable, a food item must meet all the competitive food nutrient standards.





Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 Fundraising & A La Carte Sales

WHAT ARE THE COMPETITIVE FOOD NUTRIENT STANDARDS?

- Must be a whole grain rich product, include 50% or more whole grains by weight or have a whole grain as the first ingredient; OR
- Must have as the first ingredient a fruit, vegetable, dairy product or protein food (meat, beans, poultry, etc.); OR
- Must be a "combination food" with at least ¼ cup fruit and/or vegetable; OR
- Must contain 10% of the Recommended Daily Allowance of one nutrient of public health concern (only through June 30, 2016)
 Calcium, potassium, vitamin D, dietary fiber





Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act 2010 FOOD NUTRIENT STANDARDS

How Does This Impact FBISD Fundraising?

- Organizations and CND shall work collaboratively for success in implementation of the new regulations
- The vast majority of food items currently sold do not meet the new standards (example: chicken sandwich 440 calories & 1390mg sodium)
- Organizations need to work with vendors to find new products which meet the new standards
- Begin now to ensure items meet the new standards for fall sales





How Does This Impact FBISD Fundraising?

ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

RECORD KEEPING AND COMPLIANCE MANDATES

- CND mandated by law to maintain records for all competitive food sales; including all labels of foods sold for the Texas Department of Agriculture audit purposes
- Violations require corrective action plans
