Photography Competition: Student Life or Sports (6th-12th Grade)



All projects must be submitted in Schoology (TMS5-XDFQ-GXT78) by Monday, February 2nd at 4:00 P.M. The Submission Form must also be completed by Monday, February 2nd at 4:00 P.M.

Category: Photography

A quality original photograph tells a story of a moment in time and was taken by the student. Photographs for this competition will show emotions, perspective, and demonstrate the skill of photographic elements. Photographs can be submitted under the Student Life or Sports category.

A photograph submitted under the **Student Life** category should showcase some element of life of a student on an FBISD campus. This could include a photograph from classroom moments, extracurricular activities, candid campus shots, school events, celebrations, and achievements. A photograph submitted under the **Sports** category should showcase some element of athletics. This could include photos showcasing action, teamwork, emotion, victory, resilience, or behind-the scenes shots.

HINT: To get started, you can use these <u>online tutorials</u> to review photography basics. You can also see examples of quality photography from <u>Association of Texas Photography Instructors</u>.

SUBMISSION NOTES:

To submit your photograph in the Film Fest Competition, you will need to remember a few items to make sure you get full points and your photo is not disqualified.

- 1. Photography submissions must contain your original work. Entries in this category may utilize basic editing techniques, such as cropping, contrast, exposure, color correction, etc. The entry should reflect what the photographer saw in the original scene.
- 2. Photos must be taken this school year. (2025-2026).
- 3. A maximum of one photographer may be submitted for the award.
- Photos must be appropriate for school audiences (G- General Audiences). Please see the MPA Ratings Guidelines (page 6)
- 5. Photos must be digital copies uploaded to Schoology. They need to be .jpg, .png, or .jpeg file types. (uploads are limited to 512 mb) size.

- **6.** Students will submit the film in the Film Fest Schoology Course: **TMS5-XDFQ-GXT78** and need to submit film information on the <u>Submission Form.</u>
- 7. On the submission form an artist statement must be completed. This will consist of approximately two to four sentences. (Must include why the student created this project, its meaning to them, and describe their creation process.)

Example (from a documentary) I created this film to show the story behind how astronauts train to go into space since these people dare to discover space. I became interested in this back-story of astronaut training at a field trip to NASA last year. I filmed most of the shots myself but used some stock footage from Adobe. I created original music for this project in Garage Band software.
