THINGS YOU CAN DO

The following are quick at home activities that families could do to be a Gulf Guardian:



- Pick up trash in the neighborhood to prevent it from going into the sewers or even take a trip to the gulf and spend part of the time picking up litter.
- Reduce the use of plastic in your home as much of it ends up in our waterways.
- Plant native plants to prevent runoff and help filter rainwater.
- Choose sustainable seafood at the grocery store.

COMMUNITY EVENTS



The following events could be things that are done in the community:

- Recycle old pine trees, especially during the holiday season, so that they may be used to support sand dunes along the gulf.
- Reach out to the city about stickers for not dumping litter into sewers, may be a family, church, or community project. Keep Sugar Land Beautiful can be a starting point, even if in a neighboring city.
- Look for events related to the gulf, such as turtle rescue or habitat restoration events, to participate in as a family. For example, the Galveston Bay Foundation has an event calendar on their website.
