Students may learn and explore a variety of district approved tools to safely create digital products:

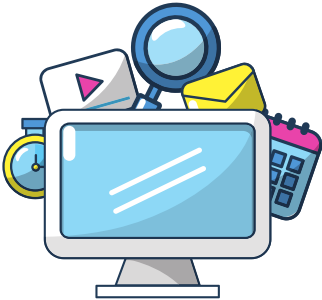
Accessible in ILink:
