
THINGS YOU CAN DO

The following are quick at home activities that families could do to be a Transportation Trailblazer:



- Go for a walk or drive and make a checklist of different vehicles you see (bus, bike, truck, motorcycle).
- Use household items (LEGO, cardboard, straws, balloons) to design simple vehicles like a balloon-powered car or paper boat, then test how they move.
- Look at a local map or globe and talk about how people travel from one place to another (car, train, airplane, boat).
- Challenge your child to invent a new type of transportation (like a flying skateboard or underwater bus) and sketch or build a model with recyclables.

- Tour a local bus station, airport, train station, or even a fire/police station to see how transportation systems work and keep people moving safely.
- Try different ways of getting to a familiar place (walk, bike, bus, carpool) and compare which is fastest, most fun, or most eco-friendly.
- Walk or bike around your neighborhood with a map, marking where sidewalks, crosswalks, or bike lanes are located. Discuss how these features impact safe transportation.
