

Dr. Lynette Breedlove is the Director of The Carol Martin Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky. Dr. Breedlove has held various roles in public education, from classroom teacher and gifted education specialist, to central office administrator. She has been active in gifted education at the local, state, and national levels, conducting professional development presentations and parent workshops across Texas and beyond. She currently serves as the president-elect of The Association of the Gifted (a division of the Council for Exceptional Children) and as chair-elect of the Special Schools and Programs Network of the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC).
