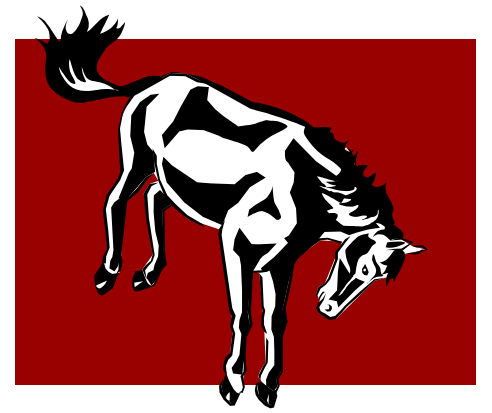

- Take responsibility for your work and choices

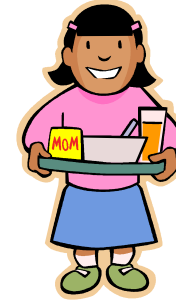
RESPECT BOUNDARIES

Arrival to school

- The building opens at 7:30
- Tardy bell rings at 8:05
- You may get in the breakfast line BEFORE you walk to the 4th grade hallway
- When you arrive (or after eating breakfast), come directly to your hallway. You do not have permission to wander around the building.
- At your hallway, sit down next to your homeroom class.
 - Voice level 0
 - Scoot up as much as possible
 - You can read, study, or do homework.
 - There are NO electronics or toys
 - Do not enter the classroom without permission



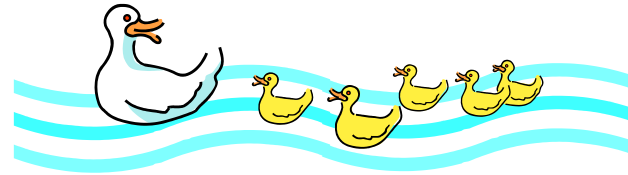
Tardies

- You need to be inside your classroom by **8:05**.
- Aim to arrive by 7:55 at the latest every day.
- Once the bell rings at 8:05 you are tardy.
- In 4th grade, it is your responsibility to be proactive and set an alarm clock and wake up on time.



Hallways

- Follow hallway expectations at **all** times:
 - 3 inches (or more) from the wall. **No touching the wall.**
 - 2 hands by your side
 - 1 straight line
 - 0 voices
- The hallways are a NO talking zone. You must remember that other grade levels are working while we are walking. They appreciate a quiet work environment.
- Stay on the **RIGHT** side of the hallway
- **Walk** at all times in the hall. Safety first!



Restroom

- We will take class restroom breaks. Please only ask to go during class during non-teaching times.
- Follow the 1-2-1 rules:
 - 1 flush
 - 2 pumps of soap – count to 20 when you wash
 - 1 paper towel
- Level 0 in the hallway.
- Keep your hands to yourself and use the restroom correctly.
- Think “win-win.” We all want to use a clean bathroom, so do your part to keep it clean! Make sure to throw your trash away!



Materials

- It is your responsibility to have your required materials with you every day:



- Homeroom will keep their extra supplies in the pockets.
- If you forget any of your art supplies, you will borrow from the Borrow Basket. **Put the item back when you are finished with it.**



Electronics

- Each class will have a class set of laptops that we will use on a regular basis starting soon.
- You may have a phone at school for emergencies only. It must be on **silent** and in your backpack at all times.
- **You may NOT get your phone out without permission at any time.**
- Once we start doing activities on the laptops, you may bring your own laptop or tablet if you choose. Make sure to bring the charging cable. We cannot help you with tech issues with your own device.



Pencil Sharpener

- Each teacher has an electric pencil sharpener.
- **You can only sharpen colored pencils in Mrs. Johnson's sharpener.**
- As long as you use it responsibly, you can sharpen your pencils whenever you need to, **as long as the teacher isn't talking.**



Tracking Behavior - Clipboard

- Each homeroom class will have a class clipboard with everyone's names and a chart for the week.
- Not following expectations means you will receive a "mark" on that day.
- We will record your marks weekly in your Tuesday folder, and we can write notes in the agenda or send emails when needed.



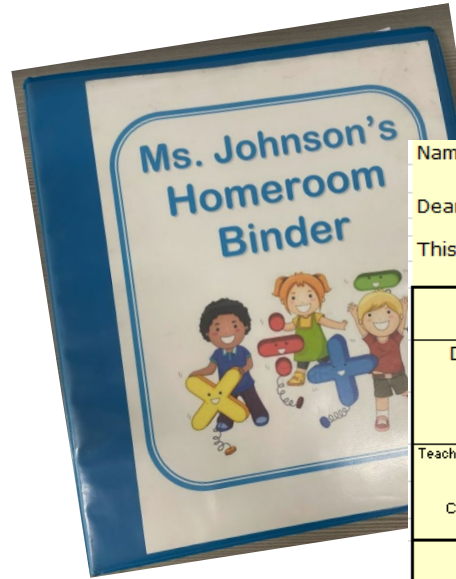

Behavior Binder

- Each homeroom will also have a behavior binder.
- If you make a bad behavior choice that is serious, you will write a reflection in the binder. These are called “Level 1 Offenses.”
- We will take a picture of your entry and email it to your parents.
- If you have 3 level 1 offenses, it becomes level 2, and we may need to meet with the administrators.
