- **AAC courses add depth to the already rigorous grade level curriculum.** These courses will take a commitment of strong effort to see success. A student who has a low work ethic or is not academically motivated may be more successful in a non-AAC course.
- **AAC courses are demanding of time.** Reading and writing assignments, as well as projects and regular homework can be expected. If you already have commitments, including extracurricular activities or other outside responsibilities, you will need to make sure you're able to create a balance and make time for your academic work.
- **The pacing of some AAC courses is very fast.** If you generally pick up new learning quickly, AAC may be a good fit. If you generally need a few interventions before picking up new material, a non-AAC course may be more appropriate for you.
- **It is challenging to be removed from AAC** – so be sure it's a good fit for your child before requesting AAC courses.

## Frequently Asked Questions



What are school hours?

- 8:50 am – 4:10 pm. Students can arrive as early as 8:20am

Do students have access to lockers?

- No. Students walk around with their backpacks daily which includes their school laptop, 1 or 2 notebooks, and a few folders, pens/pencils, etc. Textbooks are not distributed to students. Orchestra and Band students have storage spaces in the band and orchestra rooms for their instruments.

How many classes do students attend each day?

- Seven. DMS does not have blocked schedules. Students attend the same 7 classes each day.

Are tutorials offered?

- Yes. All core content (Math, Science, Social Studies, and ELA) teachers have tutorials at least once a week before or after school. That schedule will be released in the fall.

Can 6th graders play sports?

- 6th graders are not eligible to play sports, but they can audition for plays and participate in orchestra, kickstart, and band. 6th Graders can not participate in cheer.

What STAAR tests do 6th Graders take?

- Math, ELA

How many AAC Classes can my child take?

- Students can take up to 4 Advanced Academic Courses (ELA, Science, Social Studies, Math). Please check with your child's teacher to see if AAC classes are a good fit.
- For example, ask your child's Math/Science teacher if he/she would be successful in AAC Math and/or Science.
- Consider your child's last two previous STAAR Scores in the content area.

What is AVID? **AVID Elective students receive intentional support and mentoring in RIGOROUS ACADEMIC PREPAREDNESS, OPPORTUNITY KNOWLEDGE, AND STUDENT AGENCY that help them become confident individuals who can successfully navigate life and career.**

After course selection we don't do class changes.

Orchestra and band teachers will reach out to parents.
