

Dear Parents & Guardians,

My name is Angela Hsu, and I am the school counselor at Highlands Elementary. The elementary years are a time when students begin to develop their academic self-concept and understand how they learn and build confidence in their abilities to be successful at school. It's also a time when students develop decision-making and communication skills in addition to character values. As students grow and learn throughout the elementary years, they acquire and develop attitudes towards self, peers, school, social groups, and families.

Elementary school counselors are educators uniquely trained in learning strategies, child development, self-management, and social skills. As an elementary counselor, I implement a comprehensive school counseling program to support student success. This includes classroom guidance lessons that align with the Fort Bend ISD Profile of a Graduate, focusing upon knowledge, attitudes, and skills students need to acquire in support of academic, social/emotional, and career development. These skills serve as the foundation for future success.

For the 2025-2026 school year, guidance and social emotional lessons will include the following topics:

- Character Education (This year's traits: Responsibility, Kindness, Respect, Fairness & Justice, Positivity & Gratitude, Perseverance, Creative & Unique, Leadership, Confidence, and Cooperation)
- Friendship/Getting Along with Others
- Bully & Cyberbullying Prevention
- Internet and Social Media Safety (3rd-5th grade)
- Safe vs. Unsafe Touches and how to get help // Child Abuse Prevention
- Mental Wellness
- Assertiveness Skills to Support Student Safety
- Conflict Resolution
- College and Career Readiness Exploration
- Understanding Differences and Embracing Race & Culture (in support of "No Place for Hate")
- Transition to Middle School (5th grade only)
- Reducing Test Anxiety/Coping with Stress (Grades 3-5)
- Now That You're Ten (Delivered to 4th grade and 5th grade by the Fort Bend County Sheriff's Department to educate students about Texas laws that affect children once they turn age 10)

Gifted and Talented Testing

Students eligible for fall evaluation

- Currently enrolled FBISD students in grades K-11.
- Students who are not identified for gifted and talented services in FBISD in any content area.

Referral

- The online referral window will be available beginning August 12, 2025, on the GT Home Page.
- To submit a referral, the parent/guardian must use the online referral app. Use this link to access the GT Online Referral App.
- Referrals must be submitted online by the September 30, 2025 deadline. Exceptions will not be made.
- Parent/guardian must consent in the <u>GT Online Referral App</u> to have the student tested if a staff member referred the student.

Assessment

- The cognitive abilities test used is the <u>CogAT</u>. Subtests administered are Non-Verbal, Verbal, and Quantitative.
- The testing window is November 3-14, 2025 (for all grades except 2nd please see the 2nd grade Cognitive Abilities Testing page for more information).
- Students will be tested during school hours.
- Teachers must complete a School Rating Scale in the GT App for referred students.
- Parents are asked to complete a Home GT Behavior Observation Form in the GT App as part of the referral or consent to test process.

2nd Grade Cognitive Abilities Testing information:

- All 2^{nd} grade students will take this test. The testing will happen during Oct. 27 Oct. 31
- The classroom teacher and/or the campus counselor will administer the test.

Spirit Sticks and "Student of the Month"



What are Spirit Sticks?

- This is our 8th year implementing the school-wide student incentive program to recognize students showing any of our 10 Core Value character traits this year. It aligns with FBISD's Profile of a Graduate, because we want all of our students to be a servant leader, problem-solver, life-long learner, and become a caring adult. It is our campus-wide initiative for positive behavior.
- When students receive these, he/she can put it on a keyring. It can be put on his/her backpack. We want them to show off their accomplishment!

How does my child/children get one?

• **Spirit sticks** – Students will have to earn these. There are only 2 given to each Prekindergarten teacher and 3 to each kindergarten – 5th grade teacher for each month! Teachers will look for students going above and beyond to show creativity, responsibility, kindness, gratitude, etc. In some classrooms, students get to vote for their peers that show the Core Value of the month.

Are there other ways my student is rewarded for good behavior?

- Yes! Your student can also be nominated as THE "Student of the Month". We have a breakfast celebration in the library or cafeteria once a month to honor these students. The student and family will receive the invitation as a hard copy and through email.
- We also have our school-wide Scottie Bucks that students can earn for good behavior during transition times in the hallways, morning and afternoon dismissal, and random acts of kindness.
