These disciplines engage and motivate all students through active learning, critical thinking, and innovative problem solving. The Fine Arts develop cognitive functioning and increase students' academic achievement, higher-order thinking, communication, and collaboration skills, making the Fine Arts applicable to college readiness, career opportunities, workplace environments, social skills, and everyday life. Students develop aesthetic and cultural awareness through exploration, leading to creative expression. Creativity, encourages through the study of the Fine Arts, is essential to nurture and develop the whole students.

COURSES: Theatre Arts I:

This is an introductory course that will focus on creative expression through theatrical performance and design. Students will become skilled in: acting techniques, stage movement, proper vocalization methods and the development of characters. Theatre is an outlet to begin expressing yourself in ways you may have never thought. This course pushes the boundaries of self and collaboration.

Course Requirements:

Students are required to:

1. Follow all expectations verbal/written while in this course and complete all tasks.





Course Expectations:

As a Theatre Practitioner and student within this course there are expectations to follow to make sure we are in a safe and creative space always. These expectations are meant to be a guide to foster these types of spaces for students and staff. All students are to follow the below expectations as a Theatre I student and within the Theatre Spaces!

- 1. Be **RESPECTFUL** to all students/teachers/staff/admin within GBHS.
 - RESPECT YOUR PEERS (Treat others the way you would want to be treated)
 - RESPECT BOUNDARIES (Peers personal property and body bubble)
 - RESPECT YOUR DIRECTORS (The directors are here to help you)
 - RESPECT YOURSELF (Have self-respect)
 - RESPECT THE SPACE (Clean up after yourself and others)
 - RESPECT THE EDUCATION (Be open minded to the content you're learning)
- 2. No OUTSIDE FOOD in the Black Box! You may have snacks only if ALL trash ends up in the trashcan! If the Black Box is left with pieces of trash, ALL FOOD will be banned!
- 3. This is an active class, and we are always up and moving. Every day we will do a physical and vocal warm up and students are expected to participate as this is for a grade.
- 4. Demonstrate control of your body and voice. No yelling or horseplaying while in class.
- 5. Arrive on time, prepared and ready to create!
- 6. Audience etiquette: respect, watch, listen and learn!
- 7. **Ensemble** is the main word of this course. Students are expected to work, collaborate and understand various concepts that are applied to an Ensemble. It takes everyone to create a safe and creative space to be successful and everyone should hold each other and the Teacher accountable.
- 8. **PARTICIPATE!** This class should be fun and for you to be creative and create art with your peers! Participation is vital to be successful in this course.
- 9. HAVE FUN & BE CREATIVE!





Theatre Discipline Policy:

Students will be given 3 chances to fix and adjust behavior before parent is contacted. If problem persists after correction and contact with parent, then an Office Referral will be documented. Students are held accountable for their behavior and should always be respectful to the students and Teacher. If respect is disregarded the whole class is affected by one students' action.

Phone/Device Policy:

Students are allowed to have their phones or headphones ONLY when the teacher is not teaching or there are no assignments to be completed for that day. Student must bring a fully charged laptop to class every day. Students must follow the phone/device usage indicator and either put them away during warmups, performances/presentations and while instruction is being given.

Integrity Policy:

All students should have integrity/honesty within themselves, and they're work. Cheating is strictly prohibited and should not take place.

Open Door Policy:

My door is always open if you have any questions/concerns that you need to express. I am an open ear if you just want to vent or share something exciting going on! Know that I am always rooting for you and want you to be the best person you can be!

- Letters to Nowhere Drop Box
 - The Letters to Nowhere Drop Box is a mail slot to drop anything you feel like getting off your chest but just don't know how to express it in other ways. I want to make sure you have every outlet possible to express your feelings in a way that is safe for you and others. This drop box is for a SAFE outlet for students to express feelings and should not be meant in a way to cause danger to the student or others. *ALL letters will not be read and will be discarded.

Extra Credit:

Students may earn extra credit by auditioning/interviewing and being in one of the 2024-2025 season productions. Student must follow all expectations of the production and be in good standing during the process to receive credit.

Publicity Policy:

In ALL Theatre Arts courses students may have photos/videos taken of them for Departmental, Newsletter, Publicity and School purposes only.

Content Warning:

Some material that is read in this course may have mature language/content. Consent is given once contract is signed.





FORT BEND ISD GRADING POLICY

The grade a student receives in this course is determined by the following weighted percentages:

Major 50% (At least 3 per 9 weeks grading period)

The following activities are examples of criteria which may be assessed as major grades:

- Designs & Design Portfolios (concepts sketches, research, analysis, models)
- Research Project
- Projects
- Warmups (Weekly major grade)
- Performances
- Practicals (demonstrations of skill)
- Production Attendance (extra credit)

Minor 50% (At least 6 per 9 weeks grading period)

The following activities are examples of criteria which may be assessed as minor grades:

- Participation
- Weekly lessons
- Passion Talk
- In class rehearsals/tasks
- Written response work
- Homework
- General classwork assignments
- Quizzes (vocabulary)

Make-up Work

The student is responsible for finding make-up work on the class website or posted in the classroom. The student has 1 day after returning for each day absent. (example, if you are absent for 2 days- you have 2 days to turn the work in.) Any major grades or work turned in after this deadline is subject to Late Work **Procedures.** Any work missed due to a school related absence must be turned in the day of the return for no penalty.

Late Work Procedures

When any non-performance or presentation assignment is missed, the policy is as follows:

- 1 day late- the highest grade the student can receive is a 90%
- 2 days late- the highest grade a student can receive is a 75%
- 3 days late- the student will receive a zero. *Teacher may assign additional points at their discretion.

Missing a Performance or Presentation

If the student knows ahead of time that they will absent, the performance or presentation must be completed before the absence. If a performance or presentation is late or unexcused, the student has 1 day to complete the assignment before receiving a Zero. Any zero on a Major grade must be made up within the following 5 days. The highest grade received will be a 75%.
