Membership in the German Club (GC) is open to anyone who is taking or has taken a German course at Clements High School or who is interested in German language and culture. Membership in the German National Honor Society (GNHS), on the other hand, is by invitation only, based on one's grades in German (minimum unweighted GPA of 3.6 or average of 90 in all German courses) and one's overall average in all subjects (minimum unweighted GPA of 3.0). Students in German II or above are notified in January whether they qualify for induction into GNHS.

<u>Dues</u> are \$10 for German Club and \$10 for GNHS this year. Everyone in GNHS is expected to join the GC as well, i.e., GNHS members pay a total of \$20 to be in both organizations. Pay dues on RevTrak: <u>German Club</u>. <u>German NHS</u>.

Members of GC and GNHS receive "<u>participation points</u>" for every activity in which they participate. Everyone should make sure to sign in at all meetings and events so that accurate records can be kept. Participation points are important for two reasons: 1) you can earn a letter jacket based on participation points (more information below), and 2) GNHS members must accumulate 20 participation points this year in order to remain in GNHS for next year (or for seniors to get their graduation cords this year).

Of the 20 participation points that GNHS members need to earn this year, at least 5, but no more than 10, should be "**service hours**," i.e., for volunteer work in the school or the community (the same types of service that would count towards the YES program). You can submit hours on a YES form (but don't double-submit the same hours to YES or any other organization!) or you can use a <u>GNHS service hour form</u>.

<u>Fundraising</u>: We probably will not need a major fundraiser this year since we had fewer expenses than normal last year and almost certainly won't have as many expenses this year. We may have a small fundraiser with a local German restaurant – details coming soon. If we find that we need a fundraiser in the spring, we will plan one then.

We participate in the <u>Randalls Good Neighbor Program</u> and the <u>Kroger Community Rewards Program</u>. These are the easiest fundraisers ever invented, and we encourage members' parents, relatives, and friends to participate by linking their Randalls Remarkable Cards and Kroger Plus Cards to our German Club account. (<u>See separate handout</u>.) For each household that a member convinces to sign up for the Kroger program (documented by bringing in a printout or screen-shot showing a successful registration), the member may receive 1 participation point, up to a maximum of 5 points.

<u>German Letter Jacket</u>: Junior and senior members of GNHS can receive a letter jacket (or an additional letter if you already have a jacket) in German! (<u>See separate handout</u>.) Because you must participate in *many* German-related activities over the years in order to earn a letter, you should start participating in lots of events as a freshman and sophomore if you hope to earn one.

<u>T-Shirts</u>: We design a new German Club T-shirt every two years, and this is one of those years when we are NOT creating a new one. We have a plentiful supply of last year's design still for sale this year for \$10. Here's the design (white shirt):
